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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO CREATE A TASK FORCE ON MILITARY
PARTNERSHIP TO DEVELOP AND STRENGTHEN THE PUBLIC-MILITARY
RELATIONSHIP IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's people and land host more than forty-two thousand active duty military personnel, including fourteen military reservations and military training facilities; and

WHEREAS, the vast majority of the military's personnel and resources in Hawaii are located on the island of Oahu; and

WHEREAS, the Red Hill fuel leaks, military ordnance training at Kahoolawe, and other concerns have damaged the public-military relationship in Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, more can be done to foster a mutually beneficial relationship between the military and the public in Hawaii and to jointly prepare for any future emergencies; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the Governor is urged to create a task force on military partnership to develop and strengthen the public-military relationship in Hawaii; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to comprise the following members or their designees:

- (1) The Governor;
- (2) The President of the Senate;
- (3) The Speaker of the House of Representatives;
