HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO RESEARCH IMPLEMENTING A LAW TO REQUIRE LEGISLATOR SALARIES TO BE TIED TO MEDIAN TEACHER SALARIES.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, educators represent the foundation upon which our democratic society is built, fostering the development of informed, engaged, and civic-minded citizens; and
4 5 6 7 8	WHEREAS, the value placed on education in policy is not consistently reflected in the compensation provided to those who deliver it; and
9 10 11 12	WHEREAS, legislators, as representatives of the people's interests, should maintain a tangible connection to the economic realities faced by vital public servants; and
13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, a Commission on Salaries is established, pursuant to article XVI, section 3.5, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, to review and recommend salaries for a variety of state positions, including members of the Legislature; and
17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, establishing a direct relationship between legislator compensation and teacher salaries creates a shared economic interest that may foster more informed policy decisions regarding education funding and reform; and
22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, this alignment serves as a symbolic and practical affirmation of the essential role that education plays in our democratic institutions and collective prosperity; and
26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, the work of teachers and legislators are similar, with teachers:

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1 (1) Having a similar schedule to what a full-time 2 legislative calendar would be, with a two-month break 3 in the summer and two-week break in the winter; 4 (2) 5 Being in constant contact with parents, students, and administrators, similar to how legislators are in 6 7 constant contact with constituents, community 8 organizations, and agencies; and 9 10 (3) Oftentimes being a part of the community and having to 11 be approached by students families, sharing similar sacrifices of privacy that legislators experience, who 12 13 are public figures that have to interact with the public; and 14 15 WHEREAS, although teachers have to meet minimum standards 16 17 and obtain certifications through a process that is based on 18 content knowledge and pedagogy to be a licensed teacher, no 19 parallel process is established for legislators; and 20 21 WHEREAS, consideration should be given to tie the base 22 salaries of legislators to the median salary of licensed 23 teachers, thereby establishing a compensation structure that 24 honors the parallel importance of these public service roles and 25 creates a shared stake in the economic valuation of education in our society; now, therefore, 26 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 29 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 30 of 2025, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to research the requirements, parameters, and necessary details for 31 implementing a law to require legislator salaries to be tied to 32 median teacher salaries; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in conducting its research, the 36 Auditor is requested to examine jurisdictions that have 37 established laws or regulations tying the salaries of 38 legislators to other government positions; and 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 40 41 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 42 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than

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1 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2026; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and Chairperson of the Commission on Salaries. 6 7 8 El m 9 OFFERED BY: MAR 0 6 2025
