## HOUSE RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING FREE AND RESPONSIBLE SCHOLASTIC JOURNALISM AND ACTIVELY SUPPORTING AND HONORING THE FIRST AMENDMENT OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION IN STUDENT PUBLICATIONS.

1 WHEREAS, the Department of Education distributes to every 2 student a Student Publication/Audio/Video Release Form "in order 3 to protect students' rights to privacy as outlined in the Family 4 Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the Protection of 5 Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA),"; and

7 WHEREAS, the Student Publication/Audio/Video Release Form 8 must be returned with a parent's signature so that, as stated on 9 the Form, "the student's names and/or likenesses, photo, video, 10 and/or audio may be used in HIDOE school-related publication 11 print and analog/digital media"; and

13 WHEREAS, the Student Publication/Audio/Video Release Form 14 lists "name and picture in annual yearbook" as an example of a 15 Department of Education or school-related publication covered by 16 FERPA; and

18 WHEREAS, in a survey of high school student media advisers, 19 all indicated they believe their administrator believes a signed 20 Student Publication/Audio/Video Release form is required in 21 order to use a student's name and/or photo in school-sponsored 22 student-produced media, such as yearbooks, newspapers, 23 broadcasts, and literary magazines; and 24

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Student Journalism Protection Act, enacted under Act 24, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, and Board of Education Policy 101-9 allows student journalists at public schools to exercise freedom of speech and freedom of the press in school-sponsored media, and protects advisers from retaliation for refusing to infringe upon student press freedom; and



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WHEREAS, the Hawaii Student Journalism Protection Act and 1 Board of Education Policy 101-9 state that a student journalist 2 shall be responsible for determining the news, opinion, feature, 3 and advertising content of school-sponsored media; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Student Journalism Protection Act and 6 Board of Education Policy 101-9 define "student media" as 7 material: 8 9 Prepared, written, published, or broadcast in any 10 (1)media by a student journalist at a school; 11 12 (2) Distributed or generally made available, either free 13 of charge or for a fee, to members of the student 14 15 body; and 16 (3) Prepared under the direction of a student media 17 advisor, regardless of whether the material is 18 supported financially by the school or by use of 19 facilities of the school or produced in conjunction 20 with a class for which the student is enrolled; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Student Journalism Protection Act and Board of Education Policy 101-9 state that there shall be no 24 prior constraint of material prepared for school-sponsored media 25 26 except if the material is: 27 28 (1)Is libelous or slanderous; 29 (2) 30 Constitutes a clearly unwarranted invasion of 31 personal; 32 33 (3) Violates state or federal law; 34 (4) 35 Is obscene; or 36 37 (5) So incites students as to create a clear and present danger of the commission of an unlawful act, the 38 violation of lawful school or board policies, or the 39 material and substantial disruption of the orderly 40 41 operation of the school; provided that the determination of a risk of material and substantial 42



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1 disruption shall be based upon specific facts, including past experience at the school and current 2 3 events influencing student behavior, and not on undifferentiated fear or apprehension; and 4 5 WHEREAS, FERPA only restricts the release of information by 6 school officials; outside parties, including student 7 journalists, who are neither employees nor agents of the school, 8 9 are not covered by FERPA; and 10 11 WHEREAS, minors can give consent as long as they are cognitively able to understand what it means to talk to a 12 journalist; and 13 14 WHEREAS, student journalists follow the Society of 15 Professional Journalists Code of Ethics to: 16 17 Seek truth and report it; 18 (1)19 (2) Minimize harm; 20 21 22 (3) Act independently; and 23 24 (4) Be accountable and transparent; and 25 26 WHEREAS, applying FERPA to student media is unnecessarily 27 placing prior constraint on student journalists; now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, that this body supports free and responsible scholastic 31 journalism and actively supports and honors the First Amendment 32 33 of the United States Constitution in student publications; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 36 requested to: 37 38 (1)Inform administrators that parent consent is not a legal requirement for publishing student names and 39 40 photos in school-sponsored student-produced media; 41 provided that the information is: 42
