HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF ELECTIONS TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP ON AUTOMATIC VOTER REGISTRATION.

WHEREAS, the legislature finds that every eligible person 1 should be able to register to vote in a convenient and secure 2 3 way that is beneficial to new voters and administrators alike; 4 and 5 WHEREAS, key voter registration improvements can ensure 6 7 state election systems are secure and efficient, safeguard 8 votes, and save money; and 9 WHEREAS, in the 2024 primary election, for example, the 10 State experienced its lowest turnout in sixty-five years, with 11 only 32.1 percent of registered voters filling out a ballot; and 12 13 WHEREAS, to improve statewide voter turnout, the 14 Legislature must enact measures that strengthen the right to 15 16 vote; and 17 18 WHEREAS, in 2021, Hawaii established automatic voter 19 registration to increase the State's historically low voter participation rates; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the automatic voter registration system 22 established by the Legislature was an opt-in system that places 23 the responsibility for registration on the part of individual 24 voters, which fails to fully include the total potential 25 population of new voters; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, changing the State's automatic voter registration system from an opt-in to an opt-out model would maximize 29 democratic participation by making voter registration as 30 streamlined as possible; now, therefore, 31 32
