## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO PRIORITIZE A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT TO CONSTRUCT "HALAU O KAWAIHUELANI".

WHEREAS, Article XV, Section 4 of the Constitution of the
State of Hawaii recognizes both Hawaiian and English as the
official languages of Hawaii; and

5 WHEREAS, the Department of Education supports Hawaiian 6 Language fluency among students in grades kindergarten through 7 twelve in Kula Kaiapuni Hawaiian language immersion schools 8 across the State, which require teachers who are fluent in the 9 Hawaiian language; and

WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii's strategic plan identifies the University of Hawaii at Manoa as a "Hawaiian Place of Learning" and an indigenous serving institution; and

WHEREAS, the Kawaihuelani Center for Hawaiian Language is an academic department in the Hawai`inuiākea School of Hawaiian Knowledge at the University of Hawaii at Manoa; and

19 WHEREAS, the Kawaihuelani Center enrolled over eighty 20 undergraduate majors and graduate students during the 2024-2025 21 academic year, and currently teaches nearly one thousand 22 students every semester in introductory and intermediate 23 language courses, as well as general education foundation 24 courses; and

26 WHEREAS, the Kawaihuelani and its sister center, the 27 Kamakakūokalani Center for Hawaiian Studies, collectively enroll 28 more than four thousand students each academic year in required 29 general education, Hawaiian, and second language courses; and 30

31 WHEREAS, the growth of Hawaiian language fluency has led to 32 a significant rise in Hawaiian language performances in theater 33 and music, and scholarly publications in Hawaiian, as well as

research that relies upon Hawaiian language fluency for certain 1 fields in science, social sciences, and the humanities; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the Kawaihuelani Center and the Kamakakūokalani 4 5 Center have been authorized to plan a joint Doctor of Philosophy degree program in `Ike Kūpuna (Hawaiian Knowledge), which would 6 7 require graduate-level Hawaiian language fluency; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the need for Hawaiian language and Hawaiian 10 studies has led to a significant growth in permanent faculty in both programs; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the Kamakakūokalani Center has housed its faculty 14 and programs in the Kamakakūokalani building at the far eastern end of the Manoa campus, nearly one-half mile from the 15 16 Kawaihuelani Center and the offices of the Dean of the Hawai`inuiākea School, which are located on the second floor of 17 18 Spalding Hall; and 19 WHEREAS, because Spalding Hall is shared by the Dean and 20 staff of the Hawai`inuiākea School; the Kawaihuelani Center; and 21 22 the Indo Pacific Languages and Graduate Division of the College of Arts, Languages and Letters; there is no room for expansion 23 24 to accommodate both the current and the projected permanent staff and faculty of the Kawaihuelani Center; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, this physical separation has not been conducive to 28 program collaboration and curricular innovation; now, therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 31 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, that the University of Hawaii is requested to 32 prioritize a capital improvement project to construct "Halau o 33 34 Kawaihuelani", which is envisioned as an office and classroom building to accommodate the Hawai`inuiākea School's Dean and 35 36 staff; the Kawaihuelani Center's faculty and staff; Hawaiian 37 language classes; and a performing arts facility that provides a center for Hawaiian music, dance and theater; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 40 Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the Board of Regents 41 of the University of Hawaii, President of the University of 42
