HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORKING GROUP TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF CREATING A HAWAII CULTURAL TRUST TO PRESERVE AND PROMOTE HAWAII'S CULTURAL RESOURCES.

WHEREAS, Hawaii is home to a rich cultural heritage that 1 includes indigenous traditions, historical landmarks, diverse 2 artistic expressions, and significant cultural institutions; and 3 4 WHEREAS, sustained investment in cultural preservation, 5 6 heritage, and the arts supports economic growth, education, tourism, and the overall well-being of the people of Hawaii; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, various states have successful cultural trusts that could be used as models for sustainable funding of cultural 10 11 organizations by leveraging donations and tax incentives to support arts and heritage programs; and 12 13 WHEREAS, establishing a Hawaii Cultural Trust could enhance 14 financial sustainability for cultural institutions and the arts, 15 16 to provide long-term support for the preservation and promotion 17 of Hawaii's cultural resources; now, therefore, 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 20 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, that a working group is requested to be established to 21 22 study the feasibility of creating a Hawaii Cultural Trust to 23 preserve and promote Hawaii's cultural resources; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to consist of the following members: 26 27 28 (1)The chairperson of the House of Representatives 29 standing committee with primary jurisdiction over 30 culture and the arts, who is requested to serve as co-31 chairperson of the working group for the purposes of 32 convening the working group;

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1 (2)2 The chairperson of the Senate standing committee with 3 primary jurisdiction over culture and the arts, who is 4 requested to serve as co-chairperson of the working 5 group for the purposes of convening the working group; 6 7 (3) The Director of Business, Economic Development, and 8 Tourism, or the Director's designee; 9 10 (4) The Director of the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts, or the Director's designee; 11 12 The Chief Executive Officer of the Office of Hawaiian 13 (5) 14 Affairs, or the Chief Executive Officer's designee; 15 and 16 17 (6) The Interim President and Chief Executive Officer of 18 the Hawaii Tourism Authority, or the Interim President 19 and Chief Executive Officer's designee; and 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 21 to invite a representative or the representative's designee from 22 23 the following organizations to participate in the working group: 24 The Hawai'i Council for the Humanities; 25 (1)26 (2)27 A Native Hawaiian cultural organization; 28 29 (3)A nonprofit cultural or arts organization; 30 31 (4) A university or research institution specializing in 32 cultural policy or arts administration; and 33 34 (5) Any other members as deemed necessary by the working 35 group to ensure a comprehensive study; and 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 37 to examine the potential structure, funding mechanisms, and 38 governance models for a cultural trust in Hawaii, including but 39 40 not limited to: 41
