HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO SUBMIT A DETAILED REPORT ON ITS LEASE ENFORCEMENT PROCESS AND PROCEDURES.

1 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources
2 (Department) serves as the steward of the State's natural and
3 cultural resources and is entrusted with their protection and
4 sustainable management for present and future generations; and
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6 WHEREAS, the Department administers leases for the use of 7 public lands that carry specific terms and conditions designed 8 to ensure responsible use, environmental protection, and 9 compliance with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations; and 10

11 WHEREAS, the Department has stated that it maintains a 12 policy of not renewing or issuing leases to entities that have 13 violated the terms of previous agreements and that its existing 14 protocols to ensure lease compliance are adequate; and 15

16 WHEREAS, however, there exists credible evidence suggesting 17 that certain lessees, including military lessees, have violated 18 terms of their lease agreements through documented instances of 19 environmental damage, unauthorized land use, or failure to 20 fulfill contractual obligations; and

22 WHEREAS, transparent governance requires clear 23 documentation and public reporting of how enforcement decisions 24 are made, particularly when they involve public lands held in 25 trust for all of Hawaii's residents; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive report detailing the Department's
lease enforcement protocols, violation histories, and renewal
decision criteria would provide necessary clarity on enforcement
decisions to policymakers and the public; now, therefore,
