## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES' OFFICE OF YOUTH SERVICES AND JUVENILE JUSTICE STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL TO EXAMINE THE AVAILABILITY AND UTILIZATION OF AINA-BASED LEARNING PROGRAMS OFFERED TO YOUTH IN THE JUVENILE LEGAL SYSTEM.

1 WHEREAS, research shows that charging fees, fines, costs, 2 and restitution to youth is harmful to young people and their families: and 3 4 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, the consequences of such costs fall 5 disproportionately on Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, and 6 African-American youth, who are more likely to be arrested, 7 detained, and unable to afford fees, fines, costs, and 8 9 restitution; and 10 11 WHEREAS, youth involved in the juvenile justice system are frequently ordered to complete hours of community service in 12 lieu of court costs; and 13 14 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, typical community service opportunities 15 do not give youth a chance to connect back with their culture 16 and the land, preventing rehabilitation and healing; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, this disconnection from culture increases the likelihood of intergenerational trauma and recidivism; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, aina-based learning is grounded in teaching and learning through aina, which encompasses the land, ocean, air, 23 and all living things; and 24 25 WHEREAS, aina-based learning offers an opportunity for 26 27 minors to carry on the practices of their kupuna, strengthening 28 families and communities; and 29

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1 WHEREAS, through aina-based approaches, learners can deepen 2 their relationships with the natural environment, cultivating 3 connections with their communities and building critical skills that can be applied to real-world issues; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the majority of organizations utilizing aina-based 7 learning are not-for-profit organizations eager to support 8 youth; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Hawaii has already committed to providing ainabased education and stewardship opportunities to youth through 11 the Aloha+ Challenge; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, Hawaii can do more to refer youth to organizations employing aina-based learning to complete community service 15 16 obligations; now, therefore, 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 18 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 19 20 of 2025, that the Department of Human Services' Office of Youth 21 Services and Juvenile Justice State Advisory Council are 22 requested to examine the availability and utilization of ainabased learning programs offered to youth in the juvenile legal 23 24 system; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 27 Services' Office of Youth Services and Juvenile Justice State Advisory Council are requested to create and disseminate a list 28 29 of organizations employing aina-based learning that the courts 30 may use to assign community service to minors in the family court system; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 34 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services, Executive Director of the Office of Youth Services, and 35 36 Chairperson of the Juvenile Justice State Advisory Council. 37 38 39 OFFERED BY:

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
