HOUSE RESOLUTION

STANDING WITH TAIWAN TO SUPPORT DEMOCRACY AND SECURITY.

WHEREAS, the United States and Republic of China, known 1 2 commonly in the United States as Taiwan, are bonded by shared values and a shared commitment to democracy, human rights, the 3 rule of law; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Taiwan acted as a generous and well-intentioned 6 7 true friend to the people of Hawaii after the August 2023 wildfires; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the people of Taiwan have maintained endearing relationships with the people of the United States; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Taiwan is an indispensable partner in safequarding 13 peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific region; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Taiwan is the world's largest producer of 16 semiconductors and a leader in information and communications 17 18 technology and produces over ninety percent of the most advanced chips used in smartphones and data centers; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Taiwan's technology is a key driver of economic 21 growth and national progress, and United States companies and 22 23 consumers are among the leading beneficiaries of trade with Taiwan's chip sector; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, Taiwan is the United States' seventh largest merchandise trading partner (\$158,600,000,000 in total goods), 27 tenth largest export market (\$42,300,000,000), and eighth 28 29 largest source of imports (\$116,300,000,000); and 30 31 WHEREAS, Taiwan is a top United States trade partner and a key link to global technology and manufacturing supply chains; 32 33 and 34

WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the landmark 1 Taiwan Relations Act in 1979 to sustain a close bilateral 2 relationship and advance mutual security and commercial 3 interests between the United States and Taiwan; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Taiwan Relations Act serves as a cornerstone 6 of United States-Taiwan relations, preserving peace and 7 stability in the Taiwan Strait, which is crucial to the 8 9 maintenance of a free and open Indo-Pacific region; and 10 WHEREAS, Taiwan has expressed support for, and wishes to 11 12 become a full member of, the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, the intent of the United States-Taiwan Initiative on Twenty-First Century Trade is to develop concrete methods to 16 deepen the economic and trade relationship between the two 17 countries; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, to strengthen bilateral trade, the government of Taiwan has expressed its desire to sign with the United States a 21 Bilateral Trade Agreement, Bilateral Investment Agreement, and 22 an Avoidance of Double Taxation Agreement; and 23 24 WHEREAS, Hawaii and Taiwan established a sister-state 25 relationship in 1993, developing an enduring and mutually 26 beneficial friendship; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, Hawaii is one of the top exporters of agriculture 30 products to Taiwan; and 31 32 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii Office in Taipei and the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Honolulu have worked 33 together in friendship and cooperation to promote future 34 cooperation and exchanges in areas of tourism, agriculture, 35 culture, education, and trade; and 36 37 38 WHEREAS, the United States-Taiwan Education Initiative was 39 launched in 2020 to strengthen cooperation on international 40 education and highlight Taiwan's ability to provide Mandarin language instruction; and 41 42

WHEREAS, given Mandarin's designation in the United States 1 2 as a critical language, as well as Taiwan's plans to be 3 bilingual by 2030, schools and institutions of higher education 4 in Hawaii and Taiwan are encouraged to enhance their exchange 5 programs; and 6 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii and National Taiwan Ocean 7 University have signed a memorandum of understanding on Academic 8 9 Cooperation and Agreement of Cooperative Master Programs, to improve the bilateral exchange of education; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the United States has assisted Taiwan in 12 participating in the World Health Organization, International 13 14 Civil Aviation Organization, and International Criminal Police Organization and will hopefully continue to support Taiwan's 15 16 meaningful participation in these and other international organizations; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 20 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 21 of 2025, that this body stands with Taiwan to support democracy 22 and security; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body endorses the participation of Taiwan as an observer in the United Nations 25 Framework Convention on Climate Change, International Civil 26 27 Aviation Organization, World Health Organization, and 28 International Criminal Police Organization; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body supports further progress on the United States-Taiwan Initiative on 21st-Century 31 Trade; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body makes it known 34 35 without any doubt that it stands by our international Democratic partners including Taiwan; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 38 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States; 39 Majority Leader of the United States Senate; Speaker of the 40 41 United States House of Representatives; United States Secretary 42 of State; United States Secretary of Defense; United States
