## HOUSE RESOLUTION

CONDEMNING THE IMPACT OF FEDERAL BUDGET CUTS ON HAWAI'I'S PROGRAMS AND SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the Trump administration, in collaboration with 1 Congress, is implementing significant federal budget cuts, 2 leading to widespread layoffs and funding reductions across 3 various federal agencies; and 4 5 WHEREAS, these cuts have resulted in the termination of 6 7 approximately two thousand two hundred federal positions in Hawai'i, excluding potential additional losses at the University 8 of Hawai'i, thereby exacerbating unemployment and economic 9 instability within the State; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the University of Hawai'i Economic Research Organization has projected that these federal budget cuts, 13 coupled with proposed tariffs, could place Hawai'i at risk of a 14 15 recession in the coming years; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the Department of Government Efficiency, under the quidance of Elon Musk, has initiated extensive layoffs within 18 19 federal agencies, including the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, leading to the termination of approximately 5 percent 20 21 of its workforce; and 22 WHEREAS, these layoffs have adversely affected critical 23 conservation efforts in Hawai'i, notably within the Kaua'i 24 25 National Wildlife Refuge Complex, resulting in the loss of essential personnel responsible for protecting endangered 26 27 species and maintaining vital habitats; and 28 WHEREAS, the administration's attempt to temporarily freeze 29 federal grants and loans, pending a review for compliance with 30 new executive orders, has created uncertainty and potential 31 32 disruptions in funding for essential state programs and

wildfire recovery efforts; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives has endorsed a 4 federal budget resolution proposing \$880 billion in Medicaid 5 cuts over the next decade, which could significantly reduce 6 healthcare access for over four hundred twenty thousand Hawai'i 7 residents who rely on Medicaid and the Children's Health 8 Insurance Program; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Medicaid cuts would place an increased financial 11 strain on Hawai'i's hospitals and healthcare providers, 12 particularly in rural and neighbor island communities where 13 Medicaid patients represent a significant portion of those 14 served, potentially leading to hospital closures or service 15 reductions; and 16 17 WHEREAS, reductions in Medicaid funding would impact makule 18 (seniors) and individuals with disabilities who rely on long-19 20 term care services, as well as Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander communities who already face significant health 21 22 disparities; and 23 24 WHEREAS, proposed congressional cuts to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) threaten to reduce benefits 25 by at least twenty percent, putting over six hundred thousand 26 Hawai'i residents, including seventy thousand children and 27 thousands of makule, at increased risk of food insecurity; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the high cost of living in Hawai'i already puts 30 families on the brink of economic hardship, and cuts to SNAP 31 would disproportionately harm working families, Native Hawaiian 32 and Pacific Islander households, and rural communities where 33 access to affordable food is already limited; and 34 35 WHEREAS, food banks and community service organizations in 36 Hawai'i, which are already struggling to meet demand, would face 37 overwhelming pressure to fill the gap left by federal cuts, 38 leading to increased hunger and hardship across the State; and 39 40 WHEREAS, the cumulative effect of these federal actions 41 42 threatens the economic stability, environmental conservation

services, including education, healthcare, social services, and

1	efforts, and the overall quality of life for the people of
2	Hawaiʻi; now, therefore,
3	
4	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
5	Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
6	of 2025, that this body condemns the recent federal budget cuts
7	and policy decisions that have adversely affected Hawai'i's
8	programs and services; and
9	
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the federal administration and
11	United States Congress are urged to reconsider these budgetary
12	and policy decisions, taking into account their detrimental
13	impact on the State of Hawai'i and its residents; and
14	
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is urged to
16 17	explore and implement measures to mitigate the adverse effects of these federal actions, ensuring the continuity and stability
17	of essential programs and services for the people of Hawai'i; and
10 19	of essential programs and services for the people of nawall; and
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
21	Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States,
22	Administrator of the United States Department of Government
23	Efficiency, Majority Leader of the United States Senate, Speaker
24	of the United States House of Representatives members of
25	Hawaii's congressional delegation, and Governor.
