HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE FORMATION OF A WORKING GROUP TO ADDRESS THE ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS AT PŌKA'Ī BAY.

WHEREAS, Pōka'ī Bay is a vital natural and cultural resource for the community of Wai'anae, providing recreational, environmental, and economic benefits; and

WHEREAS, addressing environmental concerns is important to preserve Pōka'ī Bay and its long-term viability for future generations; and

WHEREAS, pollution, sedimentation, and lack of adequate infrastructure continue to degrade Pōka'ī Bay; and

WHEREAS, the degradation of Pōka'ī Bay has significantly impacted marine life, water quality, and public access; and

WHEREAS, the local community, residents, cultural practitioners, and businesses have expressed concerns regarding the condition of Pōka'ī Bay and the need for immediate action to restore and maintain its ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, collaboration between government agencies, community organizations, and stakeholders is necessary to develop sustainable management practices and implement practical solutions for the preservation of Pōka'ī Bay; and

WHEREAS, this body finds that the threats to the wildlife of Pōka'ī Bay and its pristine beauty requires immediate and decisive action; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2025, that a working group be established to address environmental concerns at Pōka'ī Bay; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to consist of the following members:

- (1) The Director of the Pacific Southwest Office of the United States Environmental Protection Agency;
- (2) The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources;
- (3) The Director of Transportation;
- (4) The Representative of House District 45;
- (5) The Director of the City and County of Honolulu Department of Facility Maintenance;
- (6) The Councilmember of District 1 of the City and County of Honolulu; and
- (7) The Chair of the Wai'anae Coast Neighborhood Board No. 24; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to invite other individuals with relevant experience and expertise to be members of the working group, including:

- (1) A marine biologist from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa;
- (2) A representative from the fishing industry; and
- (3) Any other members the working group deems necessary; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the working group is requested to conduct a comprehensive environmental assessment to determine the primary sources of pollution and sedimentation at $P\bar{o}ka'\bar{1}$ Bay; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 1 to assess the feasibility and estimated costs of: 2 3 Erosion control measures to prevent further 4 (1)5 degradation of the bay; (2) Water quality monitoring programs to ensure ongoing 7 assessment; 9 Additional trash receptacles and regular cleanup 10 (3) 11 efforts to improve waste management; 12 13 (4)Marine habitat restoration projects; 14 Conscious harbor practices at the bay, including 15 (5) prohibiting commercial boats from anchoring in the bay 16 and boat owners from emptying their holding tanks that 17 contain sewage into the bay; 18 19 Fisheries certification programs to promote 20 (6) sustainable fishing practices; and 21 22 Public facilities improvements to support responsible 23 (7) recreation and tourism; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 26 to make recommendations to reduce or prevent adverse 27 environmental impacts on the bay based on its assessment; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 30 to conduct community engagement and educational initiatives to 31 raise awareness of the protection of the bay; and 32 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 35 to meet on a quarterly basis; and 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 37 to provide a quarterly report to the House of Representatives; 38

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and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group shall cease on June 30, 2027; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of Honolulu is requested to allocate funding and resources to implement the working group's recommendations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Pacific Southwest Office of the United States Environmental Protection Agency; Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources; Director of Transportation; Representative of House District 45; Director of the City and County of Honolulu Department of Facility Maintenance; Councilmember of District 1 of the City and County of Honolulu; Chair of the Wai'anae Coast Neighborhood Board No. 24; and Chancellor of the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa.
