## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO ADDRESS NO-TRESPASSING POLICIES ALONG STREAMS ON OAHU AND IMPROVE COORDINATION BETWEEN STATE AND COUNTY AUTHORITIES TO ADDRESS ENVIRONMENTAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH CONCERNS.

WHEREAS, streams on Oahu are vital resources that serve as 1 cultural and community landmarks and provide essential 2 3 ecological functions, including flood management, water quality preservation, and habitats for native species; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the presence of encampments along streams create environmental hazards, such as improper waste disposal that 7 pollutes waterways and harms the natural ecosystems connect to 8 the streams, including the Ala Wai canal and nearshore waters; 9 10 and 11 12 WHEREAS, the presence of encampments in and near streams poses significant safety and health risks to individuals 13 experiencing homelessness, who may face life-threatening 14 conditions during floods, exposure to biohazards, and inadequate 15 access to necessary resources; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the lack of clear and coordinated enforcement 18 19 between state and county authorities has allowed unsafe conditions to persist, resulting in blocked floodways and 20 21 emergency rescues, and caused harm to the broader community and 22 environment; and 23 WHEREAS, addressing these challenges requires a multi-24 25 stakeholder approach that fosters collaboration between state and local government organizations and community representatives 26 to develop compassionate, effective, and sustainable solutions; 27 28 now, therefore, 29
