HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE LGBTQ+ COMMISSION AND THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN TO REVIEW THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR GENDER-NEUTRAL LANGUAGE TERMINOLOGY.

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is committed to fostering 1 inclusivity, equality, and respect for all individuals, 2 3 regardless of gender identity or expression; and 4 5 WHEREAS, many existing statutes within the Hawaii Revised Statutes contain binary, gendered language that may not reflect 6 the diverse identities of Hawaii's residents; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the use of gender-neutral language in legislation promotes inclusivity and ensures that all individuals are 10 equally recognized and protected under state law; and 11 12 WHEREAS, in 2013, the Hawaii State Legislature passed 13 marriage equality, ensuring that same-sex couples have the right 14 to marry, and the rest of the Hawaii Revised Statutes should 15 reflect this legal recognition when addressing married couples; 16 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, in 2019, the Hawaii State Legislature expanded 20 gender markers from the false narrative of the gender binary that utilizes "F" for female and "M" for male on state 21 identification cards and driver's licenses; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, now, forms of state identification also include the marker "X" for those who do not identify within the gender 25 binary; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, other jurisdictions have undertaken similar efforts to modernize statutory language to be more inclusive, 29 and Hawaii should also ensure that state laws reflect the values 30 of respect and aloha for all; now, therefore, 31 32 33 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 34



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of 2025, that the LGBTQ+ Commission and the Commission on the 1 Status of Women are requested to collaborate and conduct a 2 comprehensive review of the Hawaii Revised Statutes and 3 recommend amendments to incorporate gender-neutral terminology; 4 5 and : ; 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the LGBTQ+ Commission and the 7 8 Commission on the Status of Women are requested to: 9 Draft recommended legislation to incorporate gender-10 (1)neutral terminology in the Hawaii Revised Statutes; 11 12 (2) Draft a recommendation for bill review to ensure 13 future legislation incorporates gender-neutral 14 terminology; and 15 16 Submit a report of their findings and recommendations, 17 (3) including proposed legislation containing the 18 suggested statutory amendments, to the Legislature no 19 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 20 Regular Session of 2026; and 21 22 ŀ BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of the Attorney 23 24 General is requested to assist the LGBTQ+ Commission and the Commission on the Status of Women in fulfilling these endeavors; 25 and) 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the LGBTO+ Commission and the 28 29 Commission on the Status of Women are requested to engage with civil rights experts that specialize in gender identity and non-30 binary issues, such as Lambda Law Hawaii, in fulfilling these 31 32 endeavors; and 33 . 1 34 ÷

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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 2 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Chairperson of the 3 Hawaii State Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer Plus 4 Commission; Chairperson of the Commission on the Status of 5 Women; and Chair of the Lambda Law Hawaii student organization 6 at the University of Hawaii's William S. Richardson School of 7 Law.
