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## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTIES TO ADOPT LOCAL ZONING ORDINANCES TO REQUIRE OWNERS OF AGRICULTURAL-ZONED LANDS TO EXECUTE AND RECORD DECLARATIONS THAT ACKNOWLEDGE STATE AND COUNTY AGRICULTURAL LAND USE REGULATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS AND PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE.

WHEREAS, while nearly half of the State's 4,100,000 acres 1 is designated for agricultural use, approximately eight percent 2 of these lands is being used for actively growing crops and 18.5 3 percent of these lands is being used for grazing animals; and 4 5 WHEREAS, according to the Department of Agriculture's 2020 6 Update to the Hawaii Statewide Agricultural Land Use Baseline 7 study, between 2015 and 2020, the overall statewide acreage of 8 planted crops decreased by twenty-one percent, or 31,207 acres, 9 in large part due to the closure of the Hawaiian Commercial and 10 11 Sugar Company on Maui; and 12 WHEREAS, during this time, there was an overall seven 13 percent increase in other crop types, or an additional 7,588 14 acres, including a notable twenty-two percent increase in 15 diversified agriculture, which added 3,695 acres, demonstrating 16 that farming is still a viable industry in Hawaii; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the study also provided the following statewide statistics: 20 21 For the island of Hawaii, there are 62,461 crop acres 22 (1)and 552,091 pasture acres; 23 24 For the island of Kauai, there are 23,191 crop acres (2) 25 and 42,345 pasture acres; 26 27 For the island of Maui, there are 7,718 crop acres and 28 (3) 115,241 pasture acres; 29 30



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For the island of Molokai, there are 3,880 crop acres 1 (4) 2 and 37,867 pasture acres; 3 For the island of Lanai, there are 105 crop acres and (5) 4 0 pasture acres; and 5 6 (6) For the island of Oahu, there are 23,227 crop acres 7 8 and 18,035 pasture acres; and 9 10 WHEREAS, while the statewide totals are 120,632 crop acres and 765,579 grazing acres, for a total of 886,211 acres, this 11 total is less than one-half of the nearly 2,000,000 acres 12 statewide designated for agriculture use; and 13 14 WHEREAS, while state and county agricultural land use 15 regulations seek to require or at least encourage active 16 agricultural use of agricultural-zoned lands, it is clear that a 17 significant amount of these lands is not being used for 18 19 agricultural production; and 20 WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Plan, pursuant to chapter 226, 21 Hawaii Revised Statutes, includes objectives and policies for 22 the economy related to agriculture, including the objectives of 23 "growth and development of diversified agriculture throughout 24 the State" and "an agriculture industry that continues to 25 constitute a dynamic and essential component of Hawaii's 26 strategic, economic, and social well-being", along with eighteen 27 companion policies; and 28 29 WHEREAS, each of the counties' general plans also calls for 30 31 supporting local agriculture industries and promoting food sustainability; and 32 33 WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture and Hawaii Farmers 34 35 Union run farm apprentice mentoring programs, and the University of Hawaii's GoFarm Hawaii Program offers a Farmer-to-Farmer 36 Mentorship series of webinars and other training programs, among 37 other opportunities to grow local farmers; and 38 39 40 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the State and the counties to pursue policies and take actions that result in an 41 increase in the number of acres that are in active farming and 42



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ranching use and that increase the production of local 1 agricultural products, which will promote food security and 2 sustainability while increasing the number of agricultural jobs, 3 thus promoting economic diversity; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Maui County currently requires owners of 6 agricultural-zoned lands to submit a declaration of compliance 7 when obtaining a building permit, acknowledging state and county 8 land use requirements and penalties for violations; and 9 10 WHEREAS, such declarations should be utilized by all four 11 counties and should be recorded so that future owners are also 12 aware of these requirements; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, the counties should also make available to owners of agriculture lands information on local agricultural 16 resources, including farm bureaus and farm apprenticeship and 17 18 mentoring programs, so that owners can readily put their lands 19 into production; now, therefore, 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Thirty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 22 23 of 2025, that the counties are urged to adopt local zoning ordinances to require owners of agricultural-zoned lands to 24 execute and record declarations that acknowledge state and 25 county agricultural land use regulations and requirements and 26 the penalties for noncompliance; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the counties are encouraged to 29 promote the active use of agricultural lands by making 30 information available on farm apprenticeship and mentoring 31 programs to owners of agricultural lands; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 35 Agriculture, Director of the Office of Planning and Sustainable 36 Development, Mayor of the County of Hawaii, Mayor of the City 37 and County of Honolulu, Mayor of the County of Kauai, Mayor of 38 39 the County of Maui, Planning Director of the County of Hawaii, Director of Planning and Permitting for the City and County of 40 Honolulu, Planning Director of the County of Kauai, Planning 41 Director of the County of Maui, President of the Hawaii Farm 42
