A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PARKING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statewide
- parking program for persons with disabilities, was established 2
- under part III of chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, pursuant 3
- 4 to the federal Uniform System for Parking for Persons with
- Disabilities, as adopted in title 23 Code of Federal Regulations 5
- section 1235. The disability and communication access board 6
- administers the program, which together with the counties,
- issues disability parking permits to applicants who are
- certified by a physician or advance practice registered nurse. 9
- A vehicle displaying a disability parking permit is authorized 10
- to park in spaces designed and reserved for persons with 11
- mobility disabilities. However, improper use and insufficient 12
- 13 enforcement impact access for legitimate program participants.
- 14 The legislature further finds that adoption of electric
- 15 vehicles is a vital step in the State's efforts to combat
- 16 climate change, reach the 2045 mandated carbon neutrality, and
- create a more sustainable future. The legislature has made 17

2	vehicles,	with tax credits, and with designated charging parking
3	spaces.	These parking spaces not only encourage the adoption of
4	electric	vehicles but are a vital component to personal and
5	statewide	use. The ability to park in an electric vehicle space
6	allows ind	dividuals to make sure they can continue to use their
7	vehicle w	ith ease and have the security to make it to their next
8	destination	on with adequate fuel. The use of these spaces by non-
9	electric v	vehicles not only takes away an incentive granted to
10	electric v	vehicle drivers but can imperil their transportation
11	use by not	allowing them the opportunity to recharge.
12	There	efore, the purpose of this Act is to:
13	(1)	Establish a state accessible parking space enforcement
14		fine for parking in parking spaces reserved for

In addition to any other applicable penalties and fines, any person who violates this subsection shall be assessed a 11 state accessible parking space enforcement fine of \$100. The 12 13 fine shall be enforced and collected by the district courts and be deposited into the state general fund." 14 15 SECTION 3. Section 291-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 16 17 "(a) Any person who parks a non-electric vehicle in a 18 space designated and marked as reserved for electric vehicles or 19 parks any vehicle in a parking space equipped with an electric 20 vehicle charging system while not actively charging shall be 21 guilty of a traffic infraction under chapter 291D [and shall],

SECTION 2. Section 291-57, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

- 1 be fined not less than [\$50] \$250 nor more than [\$100,] \$500,
- 2 and [shall] pay any costs incurred by the court related to
- 3 assessing the fine. In addition to any other applicable
- 4 penalties and fines, any person who violates this subsection
- 5 shall be assessed a state accessible parking space enforcement
- 6 fine of \$100. The fine shall be enforced and collected by the
- 7 district courts and be deposited into the state general fund."
- 8 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

State Accessible Parking Space Enforcement Fine; Parking; Persons with Disabilities; Electric Vehicles

Description:

Establishes a state accessible parking space enforcement fine for parking in parking spaces reserved for persons with disabilities or electric vehicles. Increases the fines for any person who parks a non-electric vehicle in a space designated and marked as reserved for electric vehicles. Requires the fine to be deposited into the state general fund.

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
