A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRIVACY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that House Concurrent
- 2 Resolution No. 225, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, regular session of 2019
- 3 (H.C.R. No. 225), convened the twenty-first century privacy law
- 4 task force, whose membership consisted of individuals in
- 5 government and the private sector having an interest or
- 6 expertise in privacy law in the digital era. H.C.R. No. 225
- 7 found that public use of the Internet and related technologies
- 8 have significantly expanded in recent years and that a lack of
- 9 meaningful government regulation has resulted in personal
- 10 privacy being compromised. Accordingly, the legislature
- 11 requested that the task force examine and make recommendations
- 12 regarding existing privacy laws and rules to protect the privacy
- 13 interests of the people of the State.
- 14 The legislature further finds that, following significant
- 15 inquiry and discussion, the task force recommended that the
- 16 outdated definition of "personal information" in chapter 487N,
- 17 Hawaii Revised Statutes, which requires the public to be

- 1 notified of data breaches, should be updated and expanded. Many
- 2 identifying data elements relating to individuals are collected,
- 3 and, when exposed to the public in a data breach, can place an
- 4 individual at risk of identity theft or may compromise the
- 5 individual's personal safety. In its current form,
- 6 chapter 487N, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is not comprehensive
- 7 enough to cover the additional identifiers.
- 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to update the
- 9 definition of "personal information" in chapter 487N, Hawaii
- 10 Revised Statutes, to include personal identifiers and specified
- 11 data elements that are found in more comprehensive laws.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 487N-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended as follows:
- 1. By adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 15 inserted and to read:
- ""Identifier" means a common piece of information related
- 17 specifically to an individual that is commonly used to identify
- 18 the individual across technology platforms, including:
- 19 (1) A name used by an individual, including the
- 20 combination of the first name, any initials in the

1		name, whether at the beginning or middle of the name,
2		or a nickname combined with the last name;
3	(2)	A user name for an online account;
4	(3)	A mobile or home phone number; or
5	(4)	An email address specific to the individual.
6	"Spec	cified data element" means any of the following:
7	(1)	An individual's social security number, either in its
8		entirety or the last four or more digits;
9	(2)	Driver's license number, federal or state
10		identification card number, or passport number;
11	(3)	A federal individual taxpayer identification number;
12	(4)	A military identification number;
13	<u>(5)</u>	An individual's financial account number, or credit or
14		debit card number, unless redacted;
15	<u>(6)</u>	A security code, access code, personal identification
16		number, or password that would allow access to an
17		individual's account;
18	(7)	Unique biometric data generated from a measurement or
19		analysis of human body characteristics used for
20		authentication purposes, including a fingerprint,

1		voice print, retina or iris image, or other unique
2		physical or digital representation of biometric data;
3	(8)	A private key that is unique to an individual and is
4		used to authenticate or sign an electronic record; and
5	(9)	Health insurance policy number, subscriber
6		identification number, medical identification number,
7		or any other unique number used by a health insurer to
8		identify a person.
9	"Specifie	d data element" does not include medical information
10	that is p	rotected by the Health Insurance Portability and
11	Accountab	ility Act of 1996 and its enacting regulations or other
12	applicabl	e federal or state law."
13	2.	By amending the definition of "personal information" to
14	read:	
15	""Pe	rsonal information" means [an] either:
16	(1)	<u>An</u> individual's <u>first initial or</u> first name [or first
17		initial], and last name, in combination with any one
18		or more [of the following data] specified elements,
19		when [either] the [name or the data elements are]
20		personal information is not encrypted[+
21	(1)	Social security number;

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1	(2)	Driver's license number or Hawaii identification card
2		number; or
3	(3)	Account number, credit or debit card number, access
4		code, or password that would permit access to an
5		individual's financial account.], redacted, or
6		otherwise protected by another method that renders the
7		information unreadable or unusable; or
8	(2)	A user name or email address, in combination with a
9		password or security question and answer that would
10		permit access to an online account.
11	"Personal	information" does not include publicly available
12	information	on that is lawfully made available to the general
13	public [f:	rom federal, state, or local government records]."
14	SECT	ION 3. Section 487N-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by	y amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
16	" (g)	The following businesses shall be deemed to be in
17	compliance	e with this section:
18	(1)	A financial institution that is subject to the federal
19	·	Interagency Guidance on Response Programs for
20		Unauthorized Access to Customer Information and
21		Customer Notice published in the Federal Register on

1		March 29, 2005, by the Board of Governors of the
2		Federal Reserve System, the Federal Deposit Insurance
3		Corporation, the Office of the Comptroller of the
4		Currency, and the Office of Thrift Supervision, or
5		subject to title 12 [C.F.R. Part] Code of Federal
6		Regulations part 748, and any revisions, additions, or
7		substitutions relating to the interagency guidance;
8		[and]
9	(2)	Any health plan or [healthcare] health care provider
10		that is subject to and in compliance with the
11		standards for privacy or individually identifiable
12		health information and the security standards for the
13		protection of electronic health information of the
14		Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of
15		1996[+]; and
16	(3)	Any licensee that is subject to the Insurance Data
17		Security Law, chapter 431, article 3B."
18	SECT	ION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
19	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
20	begun bef	ore its effective date.

- 1 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Privacy; Personal Information; Security Breach; Notice; Identifier; Specified Data Element

Description:

Adds definitions of "identifier" and "specified data element" and amends the definition of "personal information" for the purposes of notifying affected persons of data and security breaches under existing state law that governs the security breach of personal information. Includes licensees subject to the Insurance Data Security Law among the businesses deemed compliant with security breach notice requirements under existing state law. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
