A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that over the past five
- 2 years, the rideshare industry has experienced substantial growth
- 3 nationally and in the State, transforming the way people commute
- 4 and navigate. This paradigm shift is evident in cities like
- 5 Boston, where the sheer volume of rideshare rides reached a
- 6 staggering \$45,000,000 in 2022 alone. As ridesharing continues
- 7 to grow, its impact is felt more and more in Hawaii's
- 8 communities and on its roads. In Hawaii, a state heavily
- 9 reliant on tourism, rideshare services are often utilized by
- 10 visitors. Visitors and rideshare platforms should contribute
- 11 more to address the infrastructure and road safety issues they
- 12 exacerbate and help alleviate the burden on local residents of
- 13 improving and maintaining roads and infrastructure, especially
- 14 around schools.
- 15 The legislature further finds that implementing a fee has
- 16 been successful for funding infrastructure in other states like
- 17 Minnesota. Hawaii has the potential to create a self-sustaining

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- 1 model where those benefiting the most from rideshare services
- 2 contribute directly to the maintenance, enhancements and safety
- 3 of the transportation infrastructure they utilize. This
- 4 approach not only aligns with broader initiatives to promote
- 5 responsible tourism, but also represents a responsible means of
- 6 addressing the evolving challenges posed by the proliferation of
- 7 rideshare services in the State.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to implement a fee on each
- 9 rideshare ride to support the safe routes to school program.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 279G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "\$279G- Rideshare fee. (a) There is levied and shall
- 14 be assessed and collected a rideshare fee of \$ on each
- 15 ride originated through a rideshare application. The rideshare
- 16 fee shall be levied upon the rider.
- 17 (b) Each rideshare platform shall collect and remit the
- 18 required rideshare fees to the department of taxation.
- (c) All fees collected under this section shall be
- 20 deposited in the safe routes to school program special fund
- 21 established pursuant to section 291C-4."

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1	SECTION 3. Section 291C-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§291C-4 Safe routes to school program special fund;
4	establishment. There is established in the state treasury the
5	safe routes to school program special fund, into which shall be
6	deposited:
7	(1) Assessments collected for speeding in a school zone,
8	pursuant to section 291C-104; [and]
9	(2) Safe routes to school program surcharges collected in
10	accordance with sections 291-16 and 291C-5[+]; and
11	(3) Ridesharing fees collected in accordance with section
12	<u>279G-</u> "
13	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
