A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL CRIME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as
- 2 "Duke's Law" in memory of Cranston "Duke" Pia.
- 3 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that agricultural crimes,
- 4 including theft, vandalism, and trespassing, have significantly
- 5 impacted the State's agricultural sector, leading to economic
- 6 losses and safety concerns for farmers and ranchers. These
- 7 types of crimes affect not only individual livelihoods, but also
- 8 the State's broader agricultural economy and food security.
- 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 10 (1) Establish and appropriate funds for a permanent
- 11 agricultural crimes task force to address the issue of
- agricultural crime in the State; and
- 13 (2) Establish an offense of agricultural crime for
- 14 committing property crimes on agricultural property.
- 15 SECTION 3. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 17 and to read as follows:



1	" <u>§14</u>	1- Agricultural crimes task force. (a) There
2	shall be	established an agricultural crimes task force within
3	the depar	tment of agriculture for administrative purposes that
4	shall con	sist of the following members:
5	(1)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture, or the
6		chairperson's designee, who shall serve as chairperson
7		of the task force;
8	(2)	A representative from the department of law
9		enforcement;
10	(3)	A representative from the department of the attorney
11		<pre>general;</pre>
12	(4)	A representative from the department of the
13		prosecuting attorney of the city and county of
14		Honolulu;
15	(5)	Two members representing agricultural organizations or
16		farmer associations, to be invited by the chairperson;
17	(6)	Two members from a law enforcement agency with
18		experience with agricultural crimes; and
19	(7)	One member from the academic community specializing in
20		agriculture or criminology, to be invited by the
21		chairperson.

I	<u>(d)</u>	The task force shall:
2	(1)	Develop strategies to prevent agricultural crimes;
3	(2)	Coordinate with local law enforcement to enhance
4		responses to reports of agricultural crime;
5	(3)	Coordinate with state and county prosecutors to
6		develop methods to prioritize the prosecution of
7		agricultural crimes to the fullest extent of the law;
8	(4)	Recommend legislation to address gaps in existing law
9		relating to agricultural crime;
10	(5)	Facilitate education and outreach programs for farmers
11		on crime prevention; and
12	(6)	Monitor and report on the effectiveness of any
13		policies and programs implemented.
14	<u>(c)</u>	The members of the agricultural crimes task force
15	shall ser	ve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for
16	reasonabl	e expenses necessary for the performance of their
17	duties, i	ncluding travel expenses.
18	<u>(d)</u>	The agricultural crimes task force shall submit a
19	report of	its findings and recommendations, including any
20	proposed	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
21	days prio	r to the convening of each regular session."

1	SECTION 4. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated					
3	and to read as follows:					
4	" <u>§</u> 708-	Agricultural crime. (1) A person commits the				
5	offense of agr	icultural crime if the person:				
6	(a) Is o	n agricultural property and:				
7	<u>(i)</u>	Is found guilty of committing, or pleads guilty				
8		or no contest to, any offense under this chapter;				
9	<u>(ii)</u>	Violates section 183D-26 or 183D-27; or				
10	<u>(iii)</u>	Commits the offense of negligent failure to				
11		control a dangerous dog under section 711-1144;				
12		<u>or</u>				
13	(b) Is t	he parent or legal guardian of a minor who				
14	<u>viol</u>	ates paragraph (a).				
15	(2) For	the purposes of this section:				
16	"Agricult	ural property" means farming assets used for				
17	agricultural p	roduction, including but not limited to land,				
18	buildings, equ	ipment, livestock, and crops.				
19	"Minor" m	eans any person under the age of eighteen years.				
20	(3) Agri	cultural crime is a class C felony.				

1		(4)	For a conviction under this section, the sentence
2	shall	be:	
3		<u>(a)</u>	For a first offense, a fine of no more than \$2,000 or
4			imprisonment for no more than one year, or both; or
5		(b)	For a second or subsequent offense, a fine of at least
6			\$10,000 or imprisonment for no more than five years,
7			or both.
8		(5)	In addition to any other penalties, any person who is
9	convi	cted	of a violation of this section shall be ordered to
10	make	resti	itution to the owner of the agricultural property for
11	any damages or losses incurred due to the violation."		
12		SECTI	ION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
13	reven	ues o	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
14	much	there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
16	year 2026-2027 for the operational costs of the agricultural		
17	crime	s tas	sk force, including but not limited to the hiring of
18	neces	sary	staff, equipment, and educational outreach.
19	,	The s	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
20	of ag	ricul	ture for the purposes of this Act.
