## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RESIDENTIAL LANDLORD-TENANT CODE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 521, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part VI to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§521- Amount of recovery; federal disaster areas.
5	Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, any landlord of a
6	dwelling unit that is located within an area that was a
7	federally declared disaster area as of August 8, 2023, who
8	violates this chapter shall be liable for damages to any tenant
9	affected by the violation. If the judgment is for the
10	plaintiff-tenant, the court shall award:
11	(1) A sum not less than \$1,000 or threefold the
12	plaintiff-tenant's sustained damages, whichever is
13	greater;
14	(2) Reasonable attorneys' fees; and
15	(3) The cost of the civil suit."

- 1 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Provides the amount of recovery for tenants who prevail in civil suits for a landlord's violation of the Residential Landlord-Tenant Code concerning a dwelling unit within an area that was a federally declared disaster area as of 8/8/2023. Provides for reasonable attorneys' fees and recovery for the cost of the suit. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
