A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is necessary for
the State to investigate and employ new and innovative ways of
maintaining and improving state services and infrastructure,
while ensuring the prudent and cost-effective expenditure of
public moneys.

6 In 2022, the legislature authorized a procurement 7 automation system for the executive branch and state agencies. 8 This procurement automation system increases efficiency, saves 9 personnel time, maintains consistency, mitigates confusion for 10 both the buyer and contractor, and produces accurate purchasing 11 data to leverage economies of scale. The legislature also 12 authorized the state procurement office to implement a 13 transaction fee imposed upon vendors using the procurement 14 automation system. This fee is intended to pay for the management of the procurement automation system, including but 15 16 not limited to implementation, legacy transition, maintenance, 17 system training, and system configuration. This fee is



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estimated to save the State approximately \$1.2 million in
general funds each year and will assist with funding the growth
and enhancement of the procurement automation system.

4 While the legislature authorized the implementation of the procurement automation system and a transaction fee collected 5 from vendors using the system, it stopped short of authorizing a 6 7 state procurement automation system special fund to hold the 8 transaction fee. Until a special fund is authorized and 9 established, the fees are being held in trust by the vendor who 10 developed the procurement automation system; the state procurement office does not have direct control of the fees. 11 12 The establishment of a special fund would direct that all fees 13 received by the state procurement office pursuant to section 103D-206(7), Hawaii Revised Statutes, be deposited into the 14 15 state procurement automation system special fund which shall be 16 administered by the state procurement office for the 17 implementation and configuration of the procurement automation 18 system's Marketplace and eProcurement system, as well as its 19 maintenance, enhancement, and expansion of additional modules to remain relevant and current with industry standards for the 20 benefit of all stakeholders statewide. 21

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1 In 2020, the legislature established the school facilities agency through section 302A-1702, Hawaii Revised Statutes, under 2 Act 72, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, and mandated that the 3 4 executive director of the school facilities authority serve as 5 its chief procurement officer. The amendment to section 6 103D-203, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is a housekeeping measure 7 that adds the school facilities authority executive director as 8 a chief procurement officer. 9 The purpose of this Act is to enhance procurement 10 accountability by: 11 (1) Establishing the state procurement automation system 12 special fund to receive the transaction fees from the 13 procurement automation system to pay for its 14 administration, management, operation, maintenance, 15 and upgrade; and 16 (2) Aligning section 103D-203(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, 17 with section 302A-1702, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by 18 adding the school facilities authority executive 19 director as a chief procurement officer.

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1	SECTION 2. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately		
3	designated and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§103D-</u> State procurement automation system special		
5	fund; transaction fee. (a) There is established in the state		
6	treasury the state procurement automation system special fund to		
7	be administered by the state procurement office and into which		
8	shall be deposited:		
9	(1) Vendor-collected transaction fees, pursuant to section		
10	103D-206(7), for administration, management,		
11	operation, maintenance, and upgrade of the procurement		
12	automation system; and		
13	(2) Appropriations made by the legislature to the special		
14	fund.		
15	(b) The state procurement automation special fund shall be		
16	expended by the administrator of the state procurement office		
17	for the purposes of the administration, management, operation,		
18	maintenance, and upgrade of the procurement automation system."		
19	SECTION 3. Section 103D-203, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
20	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

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1 administratively attached to them--the administrator of the state procurement office of the department of 2 3 accounting and general services." SECTION 4. Section 103D-204, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 6 There shall be a state procurement office, placed for "(a) 7 administrative purposes only, within the department of accounting and general services, which shall be headed by the 8 9 administrator of the state procurement office. The 10 administrator shall be the chief procurement officer for those governmental bodies of the executive branch as provided in 11 section [[103D-203(a)(8)].] 103D-203(a)(9). The administrator 12 13 shall be a full-time public official. The administrator shall 14 serve a term of four years, and shall be paid a salary not to 15 exceed eighty-seven per cent of the salary of the director of 16 human resources development, without diminution during the 17 administrator's term of office unless by general law applying to all deputies or assistants to department heads." 18 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2491;
provided that the amendments made to section 103D-203(a), Hawaii
Revised Statutes, by section 3 of this Act shall not be repealed
when section 103D-203(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, is reenacted
on June 30, 2028, pursuant to section 16 of Act 8, Special
Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, as amended by section 3 of Act 111,
Session Laws of Hawaii 2024.
