A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTEGRATED LAND USE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that multiple climate and 2 sustainability statutory targets have been enacted in the State, 3 including developing at least 22,500 affordable rental housing 4 units, doubling food production, increasing food exports, 5 requiring the department of education and university of Hawaii 6 to become net-zero in energy use, requiring that all of the 7 electricity generated in Hawaii come from renewable sources, 8 sequestering more atmospheric carbon and greenhouse gases, 9 requiring all state and county facilities to use reclaimed 10 water, and requiring the mandatory upgrade of all cesspools.

11 The legislature recognizes that, with the recent expansion 12 of the office of planning and sustainable development through 13 Act 45, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, and Acts 152 and 153, 14 Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, the office of planning and 15 sustainable development functionally serves as the State's 16 centralized coordinating agency to lead efforts in climate 17 adaptive and sustainable land use policies.

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1 The legislature further finds that the State would benefit 2 from a land use plan that integrates various climate, 3 sustainability, and housing goals and studies, especially on the use of agricultural lands. An integrated land use study would 4 5 help to address recent events and public opposition to 6 affordable housing projects and renewable energy projects on 7 agricultural land. 8 The purpose of this Act is to require the office of 9 planning and sustainable development to develop an integrated 10 land use study that incorporates the various climate, 11 sustainability, and housing goals and studies to serve as a 12 guide for planning and decision-making on the use of 13 agricultural lands. 14 SECTION 2. (a) The office of planning and sustainable 15 development shall conduct an integrated land use study for 16 agricultural districts, as classified under section 205-2, 17 Hawaii Revised Statutes. 18 The purpose of the integrated land use study shall be (b) 19 to:

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1 Develop land use data that can be used for planning (1) and decision-making for the competing uses of lands 2 3 within agricultural districts; and 4 (2) Determine the land use feasibility and needs of lands 5 within agricultural districts to meet the State's 6 climate, sustainability, and housing statutory 7 targets.

8 The integrated land use study shall incorporate the (C) 9 recommendations of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan pursuant 10 to section 226-65, Hawaii Revised Statutes; the state land use 11 review of districts; the Hawaii sea level rise vulnerability and 12 adaptation report pursuant to section 225P-3, Hawaii Revised 13 Statutes; and the State's climate, sustainability, and housing 14 statutory targets, as needed. The integrated land use study shall also consider the 2022 state land use review of districts, 15 the Hawaii state plan update phase one, and the soil 16 17 classification study required pursuant to Act 189, Session Laws 18 of Hawaii 2022. ;

19 (d) The integrated land use study shall include20 recommendations for each county.

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1 (e) In conducting the integrated land use study the office 2 of planning and sustainable development shall: 3 Develop data-based estimates on the amount of land (1)required to meet the competing uses of lands within 4 5 the agricultural districts by compiling and analyzing 6 existing data from various government entities, 7 including the department of agriculture; department of 8 transportation; department of land and natural 9 resources; department of business, economic 10 development, and tourism; Hawaii state energy office; 11 Hawaii housing finance and development corporation; public utilities commission; and the counties. 12 13 Secondary input shall be sought from the university of Hawaii, utility companies, nonprofit agricultural 14 organizations, the agricultural community, and other 15 16 organizations or entities deemed appropriate by the 17 office; 18 Conduct outreach to ensure county and community input (2) 19 and acceptance; and

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1 (3) Analyze the available acreage in each county along 2 with the potential impacts for the proposed changes 3 once the initial compilation of data is completed. 4 SECTION 3. The office of planning and sustainable 5 development shall submit an interim report to the legislature no 6 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular 7 session of 2026 on the progress of developing data-based 8 estimates and the progress of the integrated land use study and 9 a final report to the legislature and the land use commission no 10 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular 11 session of 2027. 12 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$350,000 or so much 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 for: 15 (1) The establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0 16 FTE) planner position, exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii

17 Revised Statutes; and

18 (2) Computers, office supplies, travel, and other expenses19 to conduct the integrated land use study.

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The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
 Act.

SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000 or so much
thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2026-2027 for
personnel cost and other expenses of the project.

8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
9 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
10 Act.

11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
