#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 121-39, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1

#### Report Title:

National Guard; Insurance; TRICARE; Department of Defense

### Description:

Authorizes the payment of allowances for TRICARE Reserve Select, TRICARE Dental Program, and vision coverage to all officers, warrant officers, and enlisted personnel of the Hawaii National Guard ordered to active duty for more than 30 days in the service of the State.

#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Defense

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII NATIONAL GUARD.

PURPOSE:

To authorize the payment of allowances for TRICARE Reserve Select (TRS), TRICARE Dental Program (TRD), and vision coverage for all officers, warrant officers, or enlisted personnel of the Hawaii National Guard (HING) ordered to active duty for more than

30 days in the service of the State.

MEANS:

Amend sections 121-39 and 121-40, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Currently, there is authority to provide health insurance exclusively for HING officers in the grades of 0-3 and below, warrant officers in the grades of CW-2 and below, and enlisted personnel in the grades of E-6 and below, but senior HING officers and non-commissioned officers are not covered. This applies when they are ordered to active duty in the service of the State under section 121-39 or 121-40 for more than 30 days, and when the service member is not otherwise covered by state- or federally funded medical insurance or by their civilian employer. Additionally, HING officers and non-commissioned officers currently are not covered for TRD or vision.

When HING service members are called to state active duty for more than 30 days, they may find themselves without medical insurance to cover routine and emergency medical care. This not only creates personal and financial hardships for our brave HING service members but also puts them at risk should they require medical treatment. It is unjust that our HING service members, who put their lives on the line to serve the State during a crisis, are left without the same level of health

insurance coverage as when they are activated for federal service. This discrepancy must be addressed and rectified without delay.

This lack of health insurance not only makes it difficult for service members to volunteer for state active duty but also poses a significant financial burden that could discourage new recruits and lead to the loss of experienced HING personnel. Given the increasing demands placed on the HING to respond to lengthy state disasters and emergencies, it is imperative that we address this issue to ensure the continued strength and readiness of our HING. it to our service members to provide them with the healthcare coverage they deserve while they selflessly serve our State, similarly to how they are medically covered on federal active-duty service, where both the service member and their eligible dependents (i.e. family) have medical coverage and the service member additionally has TRD and vision coverage.

Impact on the public: The addition of TRS premium payments as an allowance for all HING officers, warrant officers, and enlisted is an essential step in enhancing recruitment and retention of personnel for the HING, which will create a more agile and responsive force, poised to swiftly aid the citizens of the State when called.

Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill will have a positive impact on the Department of Defense and Hawaii National Guard. There are no known negative impacts on other departments or agencies.
