## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAUMA-INFORMED CARE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that children and
- 2 families who are referred to the department of human services
- 3 child welfare services branch undergo a significant amount of
- 4 trauma.
- 5 The malama ohana working group created by Act 86, Session
- 6 Laws of Hawaii 2023, has submitted a report to the legislature
- 7 that provides recommendations to create transformative changes
- 8 to the State's existing child welfare system, including having
- 9 all child welfare services branch staff in the department of
- 10 human services to receive comprehensive trauma-informed care
- 11 training as part of developing a trauma-informed system.
- 12 The legislature also finds that, in order for an
- 13 organization to fully adopt a trauma-informed approach, there
- 14 must be policies and practices that address the needs of the
- 15 staff, including the effects of vicarious trauma, secondary
- 16 traumatic stress, and burnout.

1	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to direct the		
2	office of wellness and resilience to collaborate with the		
3	department of human services to, either directly or by contract		
4	design, administer, and implement a program for trauma-informed		
5	organizational assessments and a training curriculum for the		
6	child welfare services branch of the department of human		
7	services.		
8	SECTION 2. The office of wellness and resilience, in		
9	collaboration with the department of human services, shall		
10	design, administer, and implement a trauma-informed care		
11	organizational assessment and training program, either directly		
12	or by contract, for the child welfare services branch of the		
13	department of human services.		
14	The trauma-informed organizational assessment and training		
15	curriculum shall specifically include:		
16	(1) An evidence-based assessment tool to assist the branch		
17	staff in assessing the branch's existing policies and		
18	procedures in the context of serving children and		
19	families who have experienced trauma;		
20	(2) An evidence-based assessment tool to measure the		

degree to which the branch staff addresses worker

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1		well-being, including the effects of vicarious trauma	
2		secondary traumatic stress, and burnout of all branch	
3		staff;	
4	(3)	A training curriculum that establishes a cohort of	
5		trained mentors;	
6	(4)	A branch-wide trauma-informed care curriculum	
7		accompanied by ongoing technical assistance;	
8	(5)	Specialized trauma-informed supervisor training and	
9		technical assistance to ensure sustainable	
10		implementation of the curriculum; and	
11	(6)	A child welfare services expert to consult on the	
12		implementation of the assessment's findings.	
13	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
15	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and	
16	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
17	year 2026-2027 for the office of wellness and resilience to		
18	design, a	dminister, and implement a trauma-informed care	
19	training (	and organizational assessment program for the child	
20	welfare s	ervices branch of the department of human services,	
21	directly	or by contract.	

The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of wellness and resilience for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31, 2050.
