## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FAMILY RESILIENCE PILOT PROGRAM.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that more programs and resources are necessary to increase family resilience and reduce 2

the risk of child abuse or neglect. Many families at high risk 3

4 of entering the child welfare system are unaware of available

5 services or how to access them, or public benefits are not

available to address the economic or other fiscal challenge they 6

7 are facing.

8 The malama ohana working group was established by Act 86,

9 Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, within the office of wellness and

10 resilience to seek, design, and recommend transformative changes

11 to the State's existing child welfare system. In its report

12 submitted to the 2025 legislature, the malama ohana working

group stated there is a shortage of resources in Hawaii 13

14 dedicated to preventing children and families' involvement with

child welfare services, especially primary prevention and 15

16 universal support. The malama ohana working group recommended

17 the establishment of primary prevention and universal support

- 1 programs that are trauma-informed and culturally responsive in
- 2 an effort to divert children and families away from involvement
- 3 with the child welfare system.
- 4 The legislature further finds that community and
- 5 school-based organizations are safe, accessible, and
- 6 non-judgmental spaces where families can access formal and
- 7 informal supports and referrals. Providing family strengthening
- 8 programming helps to increase parents' protective factors,
- 9 including parental resilience, social connections, concrete
- 10 support, knowledge of parenting and child development, and
- 11 social-emotional competence of children. Community- and
- 12 school-based organizations, such as family resource centers,
- 13 have been successful in reducing the number of families reported
- 14 to the child welfare system.
- 15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 16 five-year family resilience pilot program within the office of
- 17 wellness and resilience.
- 18 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the office of
- 19 wellness and resilience a family resilience pilot program, in
- 20 which the office of wellness and resilience shall provide:

1	( 1 )	Trauma-Informed peer support navigators with lived
2		experience who have gone through the social services
3		system to assist families with enrollment in public or
4		other benefits, family strengthening, and cultural
5		programming; and
6	(2)	Financial assistance and resource supports to aid with
7		food, clothing, hygiene, housing, parenting,
8		childcare, household, and transportation needs.
9	(b)	The office of wellness and resilience, shall
10	establish	n, no later than December 31, 2025, the following:
11	(1)	Data and referral system tracking needs and protocols
12		in compliance with applicable state and federal laws;
13		and
14	(2)	An implementation and evaluation plan that includes
15		specific, measurable, attainable, reasonable, and
16		time-bound goals.
17	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
18	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
19	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
20	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

year 2026-2027 for the office of wellness and resilience to

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- 1 carry out the purposes of this Act, including the contracting of
- 2 services to implement the pilot program.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 4 wellness and resilience.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
- 6 2050, and shall be repealed on June 30, 2030.
