A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RESTORATION OF BEACH LANDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the
- 2 Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, the world's leading
- 3 authority on climate science, in its Assessment Report 6 (2021)
- 4 stated that it has high confidence that global sea level will
- 5 continue to rise for centuries to millennia, regardless of
- 6 whether humans slow carbon emissions into the atmosphere.
- 7 The legislature also finds that the state climate change
- 8 mitigation and adaptation commission, created by Act 32, Session
- 9 Laws of Hawaii 2017, stated in its 2022 report to the
- 10 legislature that Hawaii is projected to likely experience
- 11 between 3.9 and 5.9 feet of sea level rise by the year 2100.
- 12 The legislature finds that sea level rise poses a serious and
- 13 imminent threat to Hawaii's coastal communities and residents
- 14 and to Hawaii's natural resources, primarily beaches and coastal
- 15 ecosystems. The legislature recognizes that the State has an
- 16 affirmative duty to preserve beaches as a public trust resource
- 17 for the people of Hawaii, and that beaches are both culturally

- 1 important and provide natural resilience to sea level rise and
- 2 associated coastal flooding.
- 3 The legislature further finds that initiating beach
- 4 restoration pilot projects, such as a project to address costal
- 5 erosion in Kahana bay on the island of Maui, will further the
- 6 State's goals of preserving the State's beaches for the people
- 7 of Hawaii. In 2017, the owners of units in the nine condominium
- 8 projects and one residential parcel on Kahana bay formed and
- 9 funded the Kahana Bay Steering Committee to develop and
- 10 implement a regional project to restore eroded beaches in the
- 11 bay. The Kahana Bay Steering Committee retained Oceanit in 2018
- 12 to assist in the engineering, planning, permitting, and
- 13 implementation of the project. Oceanit engaged in extensive
- 14 community and agency consultation and, in 2021, published the
- 15 Kahana Bay Erosion Mitigation Project Second Draft Environmental
- 16 Impact Statement, which estimated that the project would cost
- 17 between \$26,000,000 and \$40,000,000 and require the creation of
- 18 several rock groins. The Kahana Bay Steering Committee proposed
- 19 to fund the projected cost of the project through community
- 20 facilities district financing pursuant to chapter 3.75, Maui
- 21 County Code, which would require that the rock groins required

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- 1 to hold the replenished sand in place be publicly owned. For
- various reasons, this project has stalled.
- 3 The legislature additionally finds that another pilot
- 4 project that would advance the State's goals of beach
- 5 restoration would be to restore the dunes at Hanakaoo beach
- 6 park, which will build resilience and infrastructure protection
- 7 from high wave events and function as a natural buffer against
- 8 the effects of sea level rise. In addition to cultural
- 9 practices and community gatherings, Hanakaoo beach is a prime
- 10 location for Hawaiian outrigger canoeing and is the home for all
- 11 west Maui canoe clubs. Dune restoration is a nature-based, low-
- 12 impact solution that balances environmental sustainability with
- 13 cultural and recreational needs. However, further technical
- 14 guidance and assistance in using the tools of dune restoration
- 15 is needed to create a productive dune habitat and restore dunes
- 16 and ecosystem services.
- 17 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 18 (1) Amend the definition of "beach restoration" to expand
- 19 the types of activities the State recognizes as
- restorative and beneficial to beach lands in response

There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 8 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 9 year 2026-2027 for a sand restoration and dune replenishment 10 pilot project to be undertaken seaward of Hanakaoo Park on the 11 island of Maui; provided that the sand restoration and dune 12 replenishment pilot project shall not include the construction 13 of any t-groins; provided further that that sums appropriated 14 shall be provided in the following ratios: 15 (1)Twenty-five per cent to be paid out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii; 17 (2) Twenty-five per cent to be paid by the county of Maui; 18 and 19 (3) Fifty per cent to be paid by residents living or 20 owning property in the area surrounding Hanakaoo Park.

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Report Title:

Restoration of Beach Lands; Kahana Bay Beach Restoration Pilot Project; Sand Restoration and Dune Replenishment Pilot Project; Appropriation

Description:

Amends the definition of "beach restoration" to include activities undertaken to maintain and improve eroded beaches and degraded dune systems through the management of sand and native vegetation, place sand on an eroded beach, and remove abandoned remnant materials that pose a risk to public and ecosystem health. Appropriates funds for a Kahana Bay beach restoration pilot project and a sand restoration and dune replenishment pilot project on the island of Maui. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

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
