A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTORCYCLE INSTRUCTION PERMITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to:		
2	(1)	Require, starting on July 1, 2026, that applicants for	
3		a motorcycle instruction permit successfully complete	
4		a basic motorcycle rider course approved by the	
5		department of transportation before becoming eligible	
6		for the permit; and	
7	(2)	Exempt drivers of motorcycles, motor scooters, or	
8		mopeds on an enclosed training course that has been	
9		certified by the State from driving restrictions for	
10		training purposes.	
11	SECT	ION 2. Section 286-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"§28	6-110 Instruction permits. (a) Any person aged	
14	fifteen y	ears and six months or more who, except for the	
15	person's	lack of instruction in operating a motor vehicle, would	
16	be qualified to obtain a driver's license issued under this part		
17	may apply	for a temporary instruction permit or a limited	

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- purpose instruction permit at the office of the examiner of 1 2 drivers in the county in which the applicant resides; provided that the applicant complies with section 286-102.5. 3 4 (b) No person shall be issued a motorcycle instruction permit unless the person successfully completes a basic 5 motorcycle rider course approved by the department of 6 7 transportation. [(b)] (c) The examiner of drivers shall examine every 8 9 applicant for an instruction permit. The examination shall 10 include tests of the applicant's: Eyesight and other physical or mental capabilities to 11 (1)determine if the applicant is capable of operating a 12
- 14 (2) Understanding of highway signs regulating, warning,
 15 and directing traffic; and
- 16 (3) Knowledge of the traffic laws, ordinances, or
 17 regulations of the State and the county where the
 18 applicant resides or intends to operate a motor
 19 vehicle.
- 20 [(c)] <u>(d)</u> If the examiner of drivers is satisfied that the applicant is qualified to receive an instruction permit, the

motor vehicle;

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1	examiner of drivers shall issue the permit entitling the		
2	applicant, while having the permit in the applicant's immediate		
3	possession, to drive a motor vehicle upon the highways for a		
4	period of one year; provided that:		
5	(1) An applicant who is registered in a driver training		
6	course shall be issued a temporary instruction permit		
7	for the duration of the course and the termination		
8	date of the course shall be entered on the permit; and		
9	(2) If the applicant is a legal immigrant, the permit		
10	shall expire no later than the applicant's authorized		
11	period of stay in the United States.		
12	A person who is not licensed to operate the category of		
13	motor vehicles to which the driving training course applies		
14	shall not operate a motor vehicle in connection with the driving		
15	training course without a valid temporary instruction permit		
16	unless the person is operating a motorcycle, motor scooter, or		
17	moped as defined in section 286-2 that is being used for		
18	training purposes on an enclosed training course that has been		
19	certified by the State.		
20	[(d)] <u>(e)</u> Except when operating a motor scooter or		
21	motorcycle, the holder of an instruction permit shall be		

1	accompanie	ed by a person who is twenty-one years of age or older
2	and licen:	sed to operate the category of motor vehicles in which
3	the motor	vehicle that is being operated belongs. The licensed
4	person sha	all occupy a passenger seat beside the permit holder
5	while the	motor vehicle is being operated; provided that if the
6	holder of	the instruction permit is under the age of eighteen
7	years and	is driving between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00
8	a.m.:	
9	(1)	A licensed driver who is the permit holder's parent or
10		guardian shall occupy a passenger seat beside the
11		driver while the motor vehicle is operated, unless the
12		permit holder is an emancipated minor;
13	(2)	The licensed driver shall be licensed to operate the
14		same category of motor vehicles as the motor vehicle
15		being operated by the holder of the instruction
16		permit; and
17	(3)	All occupants of the motor vehicle shall be restrained
18		by a seat belt assembly or a child passenger safety
19		restraint system as required under sections 291-11.5
20		and 291-11.6, notwithstanding any other law to the
21		contrary.

1 [(e)] (f) No holder of a temporary instruction permit shall operate a motorcycle or a motor scooter during hours of 2 3 darkness or carry any passengers. $\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$ (g) No holder of a category 1 or 2 temporary 4 5 instruction permit shall have the permit renewed, nor shall the holder be issued another temporary instruction permit for the 6 same purpose, unless the holder has taken the examination for a 7 category 1 or 2 license at least once prior to the expiration of 8 the temporary instruction permit. If the holder of a temporary 9 10 instruction permit fails to meet the requirements of this 11 section, the holder shall not be permitted to apply for another 12 category 1 or 2 temporary instruction permit for a period of three months. Nothing in this subsection shall affect the right 13 14 and privilege of any holder of a category 1 or 2 temporary instruction permit to obtain a temporary instruction permit or 15 driver's license for the operation of any other type of motor 16 17 vehicle. $[\frac{g}{g}]$ (h) The examiner of drivers may accept an 18 application for renewal of an instruction permit no more than 19 thirty days prior to or ninety days after the expiration date of 20 the instruction permit, whereupon the applicant for renewal of 21

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- 1 an instruction permit shall be exempt from subsection $(\frac{b}{2})$
- 2 and (3). [c) (2) and (3). If an application for renewal of an
- 3 instruction permit is not made within ninety days after the
- 4 expiration date of the permit, the applicant shall be treated as
- 5 applying for a new instruction permit and examined in accordance
- 6 with subsection $[\frac{b}{\cdot}]$ (c).
- 7 [\(\frac{(i)}{h}\)] (i) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,
- 8 the examiner of drivers may issue an instruction permit to an
- 9 applicant with a disability who has completed a medical review
- 10 with this State, and as a condition to licensure is required to
- 11 pass a road test, but has failed the road test on the
- 12 applicant's first attempt. The instruction permit issued under
- 13 this subsection may be renewed no more than thirty days prior to
- 14 or ninety days after the expiration date of the instruction
- 15 permit upon receiving an updated medical report. Subsections
- 16 $\left[\frac{b}{2}\right]$ and $\frac{3}{2}$ (c) (2) and (3) shall not apply to the issuance
- 17 or renewal of an instruction permit issued under this
- 18 subsection.
- 19 For the purposes of this subsection, "applicant with a
- 20 disability" means an applicant who the examiner of drivers has
- 21 reasonable cause to believe may have a mental or physical

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- 1 infirmity or disability that would make it unsafe to operate a
- 2 motor vehicle pursuant to section 286-119(a)(1) and has been
- 3 medically evaluated by the medical advisory board established
- 4 pursuant to section 286-4.1."
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act shall not apply to applicants who
- 6 submit applications for a motorcycle instruction permit before
- 7 its effective date.
- 8 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
