# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RESIDENT TUITION FEE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that facilitating
- 2 postsecondary education and training for all interested high
- 3 school graduates is a matter of statewide concern.
- 4 Postsecondary options assist graduates by preparing them for
- 5 jobs and career pathways that typically pay higher wages, which
- 6 enables them to achieve their educational and career goals and
- 7 afford the State's high cost of living. Increased enrollment
- 8 and completion of postsecondary education and training will
- 9 increase the State's human capital.
- 10 The university of Hawaii amended its administrative rules
- 11 to streamline the enrollment process for all applicants for
- 12 admission into the university of Hawaii system; however, the
- 13 current statutory requirements regarding residency for tuition
- 14 purposes pose challenges for some local graduating high school
- 15 seniors or recent graduates. Specifically, some students
- 16 experiencing homelessness have difficulty providing evidence of
- 17 bona fide residency as required by statute, and students who

- 1 have complex family situations may be incorrectly considered
- 2 nonresidents. The legislature further finds that recognizing
- 3 local high school graduates as residents to qualify for resident
- 4 tuition fees would facilitate the enrollment of these students
- 5 at one of the university of Hawaii's campuses.
- 6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to simplify the
- 7 residency determination for the State's high school graduates to
- 8 enroll in postsecondary education and training at the university
- 9 of Hawaii by considering graduates of the State's high schools
- 10 to be residents for tuition purposes.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 304A-402, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "[+]\$304A-402[+] Residence for tuition purposes; basic
- 14 rule. The board of regents shall adopt the necessary rules
- 15 defining residence for tuition purposes herein; provided that
- 16 the basic rule shall be that a student shall qualify for the
- 17 resident tuition fee only if the following criteria are met:
- 18 (1) The adult student, or in the case of a minor student,
- the student's parents or guardians, has or have been a
- 20 bona fide resident of this State for at least twelve
- 21 consecutive months next preceding the student's first

2	seme	ester or term in which the student is enrolling at
3	the	particular college or campus; and
4 (2)	The	adult or minor student [has]:
5	(A)	<u>Has</u> not been claimed as a dependent for tax
6		purposes for at least twelve months next
7		preceding the student's first day of officially
8		scheduled instruction for any semester or term in
9		which the student is enrolling at the particular
10		college or campus by the student's parents or
11		guardians who are nonresidents of the State;
12		provided that this provision shall not apply in
13		cases where the parent claiming the student as a
14		dependent is entitled to do so under a child
15		support order or agreement issued or entered into
16		in conjunction with a divorce proceeding or legal
17		separation agreement and the other parent and the
18		student meet the criteria set forth in
19		paragraph (1) $[-]$ ; or
20	(B)	Graduated from a high school in the State within
21		four years preceding the student's first day of

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1	officially scheduled instruction for any semester
2	or term in which the student is enrolling at the
3	particular college or campus and will enroll in
4	an undergraduate degree program."
5	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
7	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 31, 2050.

### Description:
