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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

SECTION 1. Section 304A-2153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII RELIEF FUNDING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$304A-2153 University of Hawaii tuition and fees special 4 **fund.** (a) There is established the [University] university of 5 Hawaii tuition and fees special fund into which shall be 6 deposited all revenue collected by the university for regular, 7 summer, and continuing education credit tuition, tuition-related 8 course and fee charges, and any other charges to students, 9 except as provided by law. Moneys deposited into the fund shall 10 be expended to maintain or improve the university's programs and 11 operations and shall not be: 12 (1) Used as a justification for reducing any budget
- request or allotment to the university unless the university requests such a reduction;
- 15 (2) Transferred unless otherwise authorized by the legislature; and

- (3) Restricted by the governor or the director of finance
  without the prior approval of the legislature.
- 3 Any rule, policy, or action of any agency or individual in
- 4 contravention of this subsection shall be void as against public
- 5 policy.
- **6** (b) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the board of
- 7 regents may authorize expenditures of up to \$3,000,000 annually,
- 8 excluding in-kind services, from this fund for the purposes of
- 9 promoting alumni relations and generating private donations for
- 10 deposit into the University of Hawaii Foundation for the
- 11 purposes of the university. Any expenditure authorized pursuant
- 12 to this subsection shall be for a public purpose and shall not
- 13 be subject to chapters 42F, 103, 103D, and 103F. The university
- 14 shall submit a comprehensive report to the legislature detailing
- 15 the use of any funds authorized by the board under this
- 16 subsection no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 17 each regular session.
- 18 The report shall:
- 19 (1) Identify each department of the University of Hawaii
- 20 Foundation supported by moneys from the fund;

1	(2)	Describe the purposes and activities of each		
2		department identified in paragraph (1) and how it		
3		participates in fundraising activities and benefits		
4		the university;		
5	(3)	Provide the total expenditures of each department		
6		identified in paragraph (1) by primary expense		
7		categories;		
8	(4)	Identify all moneys from the fund transferred to any		
9		fund of the university and provide a justification of		
10		how these moneys are used to benefit the university;		
11	(5)	Provide a financial summary of the operating		
12		activities of the University of Hawaii Foundation,		
13		including revenues and expenditures by major reporting		
14		categories; and		
15	(6)	Identify amounts and purposes of all expenditures from		
16		the [University] university of Hawaii support fund.		
17	(c)	Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the		
18	university may transfer funds from the [University] university			
19	of Hawaii tuition and fees special fund into the scholarship and			
20	assistance special fund established pursuant to section			
21	304A-2159.			

1	(d) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the board of					
2	regents may authorize expenditures of up to \$3,000,000 annually,					
3	excluding in-kind services, from this fund for the purposes of					
4	providing student aid in direct response to an emergency or a					
5	disaster, as declared by the governor. The university shall					
6	submit a comprehensive report to the legislature detailing the					
7	use of any funds authorized by the board under this subsection					
8	no later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular					
9	session.					
10	[ <del>(d)</del> ] <u>(e)</u> In estimating its quarterly budget requirements,					
11	each campus of the [University] university of Hawaii shall					
12	prepare a plan for the fiscal year for the operation of each of					
13	the programs that it is responsible for administering. The					
14	operations plan shall be:					
15	(1) In such form and content as the vice president for					
16	budget and finance and chief financial officer of the					
17	[University] university of Hawaii may prescribe; and					
18	(2) Submitted, together with the estimated quarterly					
19	budget requirements, to the vice president for budget					
20	and finance and chief financial officer on such date					

1	as the vice president for budget and finance and chief					
2	financial officer may prescribe.					
3	$[\frac{(e)}{(f)}]$ The president and vice president for budget and					
4	finance and chief financial officer of the [University]					
5	university of Hawaii:					
6	(1)	Shal	l review the operations plan for each campus to			
7		dete	rmine if:			
8		(A)	It is consistent with the policy decisions of the			
9			board of regents and appropriations by the			
10			legislature;			
11		(B)	It reflects proper planning and efficient			
12			management methods; and			
13		(C)	Appropriations have been made for the planned			
14			purpose and will not be exhausted before the end			
15			of the fiscal year;			
16	(2)	Shal	l approve the operations plan for each campus if			
17		they	determine that the operations plan meets the			
18		requ	irements of paragraph (1); and			
19	(3)	May	modify or withhold the planned expenditures of any			
20		camp	us at any time during the appropriations period.			

- 1 [(f)] (g) At the end of each fiscal year, the moneys in
- 2 the [University] university of Hawaii tuition and fees special
- 3 fund for each campus shall lapse to the credit of program
- 4 identification number UOH900 ([University] university of Hawaii,
- 5 system wide support)."
- 6 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
