A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGE VERIFICATION FOR APP DEVELOPERS AND APP STORES ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the rapid growth in
- 2 the use of mobile phones, tablets, and digital apps has led to
- 3 an increasing concern about the exposure of minors to age-
- 4 inappropriate or harmful content, including apps, video games,
- 5 social media, and other online services. While several mobile
- 6 platforms and app stores have age restrictions in place, there
- 7 is no comprehensive requirement for robust age verification
- 8 systems to ensure that minors cannot access content or services
- 9 not suitable for their age group.
- 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish age
- 11 verification requirements for app developers and companies
- 12 operating app stores in the State to prevent minors from
- 13 accessing age-restricted content and services, ensuring better
- 14 protection for young people from potential harm.

1	SECT	ION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a	new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follow	s:
4		"CHAPTER
5	AGE	VERIFICATION FOR APP DEVELOPERS AND APP STORES ACT
6	\$	-1 Short title. This chapter shall be known and may
7	be cited	as the "Hawaii Age Verification for App Developers and
8	App Store	s Act".
9	\$	-2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
10	"Adu	lt" means an individual who is at least seventeen years
11	of age.	
12	"Age	category" means the category of an individual based on
13	the indiv	idual's age. The age categories are designated as
14	follows:	
15	(1)	Adult category for individuals who are at least
16		eighteen years of age;
17	(2)	Teenager category for individuals who are at least
18		sixteen years of age but under the age of eighteen;
19	(3)	Child category for individuals who are at least
20		thirteen years of age but under the age of sixteen;
21		and

- 1 (4) Young child category for individuals who are under the age of thirteen.
- "Age rating" means a public display that indicates the
- 4 appropriateness of an app for different age categories.
- 5 "App" means a software application or electronic service
- 6 that may be run or directed by a user on a computer, mobile
- 7 device, or any other general purpose computing device.
- 8 "App store" means a publicly available website, software
- 9 application, or other electronic service that distributes apps
- 10 from third-party developers to users of a computer, mobile
- 11 device, or any other general purpose computing device.
- "Covered app store provider" means any person that owns or
- 13 controls an app store that is available for users in the State.
- 14 "Department" means the department of commerce and consumer
- 15 affairs.
- 16 "Developer" means any person that owns or controls an app
- 17 on the app store of a covered app provider.
- 18 "Know" means to have actual knowledge or knowledge fairly
- 19 inferred based on objective circumstances.
- 20 "Minor" means an individual who is under sixteen years of
- **21** age.



- 1 "Mobile device" means a smartphone or tablet computer that
- 2 is capable of running a mobile operating system.
- 3 "Mobile operating system" means a set of software that
- 4 manages mobile device hardware resources and provides common
- 5 services for mobile device programs.
- 6 "Parent" means, with respect to a particular minor, an
- 7 adult with the legal right to make decisions on behalf of that
- 8 minor, including:
- 9 (1) A natural parent;
- 10 (2) An adoptive parent;
- 11 (3) A legal guardian; and
- 12 (4) An individual with legal custody over the minor.
- "Signal" means age-bracketed data sent by a real-time
- 14 secure application programming interface or operating system
- 15 that is likely to be accessed by minors.
- "User" means an individual who uses an app store or
- 17 purchases and uses an app from an app store.
- "Verifiable parental consent" means authorization that is
- 19 provided by a parent whom a covered app store provider has
- 20 verified is an adult, in response to:

1	(1)	A disclosure from a covered app store provider
2		identifying what the parent is specifically consenting
3		to, including the age rating for the app or in-app
4		purchase at issue; and
5	(2)	The parent being given a clear choice to consent to or
6		decline to consent to the request from the covered app
7		provider.
8	\$	-3 Covered app store provider requirements; age
9	verificat	ion; parental consent; age rating display; parental
10	controls.	(a) Each covered app store provider shall:
11	(1)	Determine the age category for each individual in the
12		State that uses the provider's app store and verify
13		the individual's age using commercially reasonable
14		methods;
15	(2)	Provide a mechanism for a parent to:
16		(A) Block a minor from downloading any app unsuitable
17		for the age category of the minor; or
18		(B) Consent to the download of any app; and
19	(3)	Obtain verifiable parental consent before allowing a
20		minor in the State to:
21		(A) Use its app store; or

		(b) Downtoad and purchase any app from its app score,
2		including making in-app purchases;
3		provided that consent shall be obtained on a download-
4		by-download or a purchase-by-purchase basis by
5		default, provided further that the verifiable parental
6		consent for the purchase of an app shall be valid for
7		no longer than seven days.
8	(b)	Any covered app store provider that owns or controls a
9	mobile de	vice's mobile operating system shall, to the extent
10	practicab	le, provide to parents a clear and easy mechanism to
11	set:	
12	(1)	Filters that prevent a minor from accessing any adult
13		website on the web browser of the mobile device; and
14	(2)	Usage limits, including daily limits and limitations
15		during school and evening hours.
16	(c)	To the extent a covered app store provider displays
17	age ratin	gs or descriptions of content, the covered app store
18	provider	shall display the age rating and description of content

for each app available in the provider's app store in a clear

and prominent manner, including information regarding the

minimum age category suitable for usage of an app.

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1	(d) A covered app store provider shall provide developers
2	the ability to determine, in real time, the age category of any
3	user and, with respect to any user that is a minor, whether the
4	covered app store provider has obtained verifiable parental
5	consent pursuant to this section.

- (e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to:
- 7 (1) Prevent a covered app store provider from taking
 8 reasonable measures to block, detect, or prevent the
 9 distribution of unlawful, obscene, or other harmful
 10 material to minors; block or filter spam; prevent
 11 criminal activity; or protect the security of an app
 12 store or app;
 - (2) Require a covered app store provider to disclose any information about a user to a developer other than the user's age category and, with respect to any user that is a minor, whether the covered app store provider has obtained verifiable parental consent pursuant to this section;
 - (3) Allow a covered app store provider to use any measures required by this section in a way that is arbitrary, capricious, anti-competitive, or unlawful; or

1	(4)	Affect or restrict the expression of political,
2		religious, or other viewpoints.
3	\$	-4 Developer obligations; age rating; content
4	descripti	on; verification of age category and parental consent;
5	time rest	rictions. (a) Any developer that offers users with a
6	descripti	on of content or age rating of the developer's app
7	shall cle	arly provide to users and each app store available in
8	the State	the:
9	(1)	Description of the app's content; and
10	(2)	Identification of the age category eligible to use the
11		app, consistent with the rating system developed in
12		accordance with the rules adopted by the department.
13	(b)	Each developer shall:
14	(1)	To the extent technically feasible, use the
15		application programming interface of a covered app
16		store provider to verify:
17		(A) The age category of its users; and
18		(B) In the case of a minor, whether verifiable
19		parental consent has been obtained before
20		allowing the use of the developer's app or in-app
21		purchases;

1	(2) Provide readily available features for a parent to
2	implement time restrictions for the developer's app,
3	including the ability to view metrics reflecting the
4	amount of time that a minor is using the app and set
5	daily time limits on a minor's use of the app; and
6	(3) Use a covered app store provider's signal to determine
7	the age category of a user.
8	§ -5 Violations. Any violation of this chapter shall
9	constitute an unfair or deceptive act or practice under section
10	480-2. All remedies, penalties, and authority granted to the
11	attorney general by chapter 480 shall be available to the
12	attorney general in the enforcement of this chapter."
13	SECTION 3. No later than July 1, 2026, the department of
14	commerce and consumer affairs shall adopt rules in accordance
15	with chapter 91 to implement this Act.
16	SECTION 4. If any provision of this Act, or the
17	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
18	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
19	applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
20	invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
21	of this Act are severable.

SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
provided that section 2 shall take effect on July 1, 2027.

Report Title:

DCCA; Age Verification for App Developers and App Stores Act; Mobile Devices; Age Ratings; Age Categories; Minors; Parental Consent; Filters; Usage Limits; Penalty; Rules

Description:

Beginning 7/1/2027, requires app store providers to determine the age category for each of their users in the State and verify their age; provide a mechanism for parents to block minors from downloading unsuitable apps; and obtain parental consent before allowing a minor to use their app store or download and purchase apps. Requires certain app store providers to provide parents with a mechanism to set filters and usage limits for minors. Requires certain app store providers to display age ratings and content description for each app available in their app store. Establishes age verification and parental consent requirements for certain app developers. Establishes violations as unfair or deceptive act or practice. Requires the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to adopt rules no later than 7/1/2026.

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
