A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the mission of the
- 2 state foundation on culture and the arts is to promote,
- 3 perpetuate, preserve, and encourage culture and the arts as
- 4 central to the quality of life and people of Hawaii. One of the
- 5 foundation's strategic priorities includes increasing public
- 6 accessibility to arts and culture.
- 7 The foundation administers the state art museum and the art
- 8 in public places and relocatable works of art programs, using
- 9 the works of art special fund created pursuant to
- 10 section 103-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and also issues grants
- 11 through its foundation grants program. The museum and these
- 12 programs aim to support, promote, and recognize the excellence
- 13 of the State's diverse artists; create, display, and maintain in
- 14 public places and the state art museum a collection of works of
- 15 art that represent the diversity and excellence of the State's
- 16 artistic expression; and provide the fullest possible access to

- 1 the highest quality aesthetic and educational experiences
- 2 available to all the citizens of the State.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the performing arts also
- 4 represent various mediums that express creativity through
- 5 singing, dancing, theatre, and musical performances. To ensure
- 6 a wide range of artistic creativity and expression in the State,
- 7 performing arts should also be recognized as a medium to provide
- 8 Hawaii's people with creative, educational, and aesthetic
- 9 performances that tell meaningful stories and provide engaging
- 10 experiences.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to further the foundation's
- 12 endeavors by:
- 13 (1) Establishing the performing arts grants program, under
- the foundation's existing foundation grant program, to
- support performing arts in the State;
- 16 (2) Clarifying the scope of the state foundation on
- 17 culture and the arts' responsibilities to include the
- 18 coordination, planning, promotion, marketing, and
- 19 execution of performing arts events; and
- 20 (3) Appropriating funds to provide grants under the
- 21 performing arts grants program.

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately
- 3 designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "§9- Performing arts grants program. (a) There is
- 5 established a performing arts grants program, to be placed in
- 6 the foundation for administrative purposes, to provide grants
- 7 for the coordination, planning, promotion, marketing, and
- 8 execution of performing arts events.
- **9** (b) The foundation shall administer the performing arts
- 10 grants program in accordance with this part.
- 11 (c) The foundation shall submit an annual report of
- 12 performing arts grants awarded and the outcomes of each
- 13 performing arts event that received a grant to the legislature
- 14 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 15 session of 2026 and every regular session thereafter."
- 16 SECTION 3. Section 9-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended as follows:
- 18 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 19 and to read:

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2	intended to be performed before an audience, including dance,		
3	singing, musical performances, and theatre."		
4	2. By amending the definition of "arts" to read:		
5	""Arts" includes music, dance, painting, drawing,		
6	sculpture, architecture, drama, poetry, prose, crafts,		
7	industrial design, interior design, fashion design, photography,		
8	television, motion picture art, unique or decorative plants,		
9	landscaping, and all other performing arts and creative activity		
10	of imagination and beauty."		
11	SECTION 4. Section 9-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"[+]\$9-21[+] Purpose. The foundation shall administer the		
14	art in public places and relocatable works of art programs,		
15	pursuant to section 103-8.5, and the state art museum to achieve		
16	the following purposes:		
17	(1) Replace in public state buildings the natural beauty		
18	displaced in construction with works of art expressive		
19	of the State's cultural, creative, and traditional		
20	arts of its various ethnic groups;		

""Performing arts" includes arts or skills that are

1	(2)	Support, promote, and recognize excellence of the
2		State's diverse cultural, creative, and traditional
3		artists; [and]
4	(3)	Create, display, and maintain in public places and the
5		state art museum a collection of works of art, and
6		coordinate, plan, promote, market, and execute
7		performing arts events, that:
8		(A) [Represents] Represent the diversity and
9		excellence of the State's artistic expression;
10		and
11		(B) [Provides] Provide to all the citizens of the
12		State the fullest possible access to the highest
13		quality aesthetic and educational experiences
14		available."
15	SECT	ION 5. Section 103-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended a	s follows:
17	1.	By amending subsection (b) to read:
18	"(b)	The works of art special fund shall be used solely
19	for the fo	ollowing purposes:
20	(1)	Costs related to the acquisition of works of $art[_{ au}]$
21		and coordination, planning, promotion, marketing, and

1		execution of performing arts events, including any
2		consultant or staff services required to carry out the
3		art in public places and relocatable works of art
4		programs;
5	(2)	Site modifications, display, and interpretive work
6		necessary for the exhibition of works of art[+] or for
7		performing arts events;
8	(3)	Upkeep services, including maintenance, repair, and
9		restoration of works of art;
10	(4)	Storing and transporting works of art."
11	2.	By amending subsection (d) to read:
12	"(d)	The comptroller and the state foundation on culture
13	and the a	rts shall decide on the specific art objects to
14	acquire[,] and specific performing arts events to coordinate,
15	plan, pro	mote, market, and execute, giving first consideration
16	to placin	g appropriate pieces of art at the locations of the
17	original	appropriation.
18	The	selection of, commissioning artists for, reviewing of
19	design, e	xecution, [and] placement, coordination, planning,
20	promotion	, and marketing of, and the acceptance of works of art
21	shall be	the responsibility of the comptroller and the state

- 1 foundation on culture and the arts in consultation with the
- 2 affected agency or department.
- 3 Expenditures from the works of art special fund shall be
- 4 made by the comptroller."
- 5 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
- 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 9 2026-2027 to provide grants under the performing arts grants
- 10 program.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the state
- 12 foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

Description:

Establishes the Performing Arts Grants Program to support performing arts in the State. Clarifies the scope of the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts' responsibilities to include the coordination, planning, promotion, marketing, and execution of performing arts events. Allows the use of moneys from the Works of Art Special Fund for performing arts. Appropriates funds to provide grants under the Performing Arts Grants Program.

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
