## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NAIL TECHNICIANS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that requiring nail
2	technicians to obtain a cosmetology license requires nail
3	technicians to learn skills irrelevant to their profession.
4	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to exempt nail
5	technicians from licensing requirements.
6	SECTION 2. Section 439A-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended as follows:
8	1. By amending the definition of "beauty operator" to
9	read:
10	""Beauty operator" means one of the following license
11	categories: cosmetologist, hairdresser, <u>or</u> esthetician[ <del>, or nail</del>

14	""Cosmetologist" means a licensed person who engages in the
15	practices of a hairdresser $[\tau]$ or esthetician $[\tau]$ and nail
