#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LICENSURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 451J-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

3 "\$451J-7 Application for licensure. Any person who files
4 an application with the department after December 31, 1998,
5 shall be issued a license by the department if the applicant
6 provides satisfactory evidence to the department that the
7 applicant is qualified for licensure pursuant to the
8 requirements of this chapter and meets the following
9 qualifications:

10	(1)	Has completed a master's degree or doctoral degree
11		from an accredited educational institution in marriage
12		and family therapy or in an allied field related to
13		the practice of mental health counseling which
14		includes or is supplemented by graduate level course
15		work comprising a minimum of [thirty-three] thirty-six
16		semester, or [ <del>forty-four</del> ] <u>forty-eight</u> quarter hours in
17		the following course areas:

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1		(A)	Marriage and family studiesnine semester or
2			twelve quarter hours;
3		(B)	Marriage and family therapy studiesnine
4			semester or twelve quarter hours;
5		(C)	Human developmentnine semester or twelve
6			quarter hours;
7		(D)	Ethical and professional studiesthree semester
8			or four quarter hours; [ <del>and</del> ]
9		(E)	Researchthree semester or four quarter hours;
10			and
11		<u>(F)</u>	Courses related to domestic violencethree
12			semester or four quarter hours;
13	(2)	Has	one year practicum with three hundred hours

15	(3)	Comp	letes one thousand hours of direct marriage and
16		fami	ly therapy, and two hundred hours clinical
17		supe	rvision in not less than twenty-four months; and
18	(4)	Has	passed the National Marriage and Family Therapy
19		Exam	in accordance with section 451J-8.

8	2019, and prior to every triennial renewal thereafter, each
9	licensee shall:
10	(1) Pay all required fees; and
11	(2) Complete a minimum of forty-five credit hours of
12	continuing education courses within the three-year
13	period preceding the renewal date; provided that a
14	minimum of six credit hours shall be in ethics
15	courses $[-]$ ; provided further that a minimum of two
16	credit hours shall be in courses related to domestic
17	violence."
18	SECTION 3. Section 453D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
20	"(a) An applicant shall be issued a license by the
21	department if the applicant provides satisfactory evidence to

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1 the department that the applicant is qualified for licensure 2 pursuant to the requirements of this chapter and meets the 3 following qualifications:

4 (1) Receipt of a master's degree or doctoral degree from 5 an accredited educational institution in counseling or 6 in an allied field related to the practice of mental 7 health counseling that includes, or is supplemented 8 by, graduate level course work in counseling 9 comprising a minimum of forty-eight semester hours or 10 seventy-two quarter hours in the following course areas, with a minimum of three semester hours or five 11 12 quarter hours in each course area as indicated below: 13 (A) Human growth and development, including but not 14 limited to the study of life span development, 15 strategies to facilitate that development and transitions, theories of learning and personality 16 17 development, and human behavior to include 18 crisis, disabilities, addictive behavior, and 19 environmental factors; (B) Social and cultural foundations, including but 20

21 not limited to the study of issues and trends in

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1		a multicultural and diverse society, including
2		characteristics of diverse groups that may
3		include but are not limited to age, race,
4		religious or sexual preference, physical
5		disability, ethnicity and culture, gender,
6		socioeconomics, intellectual ability, and
7		individual, family, and group strategies with
8		diverse populations;
9	(C)	Counseling theories and applications, including
10		but not limited to counseling and consultation,
11		including both individual and systems
12		perspectives, interviewing, assessment, and
13		counseling skills, as well as applying
14		principles, methods, and theories of counseling,
15		treatment and counseling of mental and emotional
16		disorders, and educational techniques aimed at
17		preventing these disorders with individuals and
18		families;
19	(D)	Group theory and practice, including but not
20		limited to principles of group dynamics, group
21		process, group leadership styles, theories and

1		methods of group counseling, and the application
2		of theory to the group processes;
3	(E)	Career and lifestyle development, including but
4		not limited to the study of vocational
5		development theories and decision-making models,
6		assessment instruments, and techniques, types,
7		sources, and uses of occupational and educational
8		information systems, career development
9		applications, and career counseling processes,
10		techniques, and resources;
11	(F)	Appraisal of human behavior, including but not
12		limited to assessment and diagnosis of disorders
13		with an emphasis on DSM categories and an
14		understanding of these disorders relative to the
15		counseling context;
16	(G)	Tests and measurements, including but not limited
17		to theoretical and historical bases for
18		assessment techniques, and assessment methods,
19		including analysis of various types of tests to
20		select, administer, interpret, and use assessment

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1		and evaluation instruments and techniques in
2		counseling;
3	(H)	Research and program evaluation, including but
4		not limited to research design and methods,
5		statistical analysis, principles, practices, and
6		application of needs assessment, and program
7		evaluation;
8	(I)	Professional orientation and ethics, including
9		but not limited to the history of the helping
10		profession, professional roles and functions,
11		ethical standards, confidentiality, professional
12		organizations, and the public policy process,
13		including advocacy on behalf of the profession
14		and its clientele; [ <del>and</del> ]
15	(J)	At least two academic terms of supervised mental
16		health practicum intern experience for graduate
17		credit of at least six semester hours or ten
18		quarter hours in a mental health counseling
19		setting, with a total of three hundred hours of
20		supervised client contact. The practicum
21		experience shall be completed under the clinical

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1 supervision of a person who is licensed as a
2 mental health counselor, psychologist, clinical
3 social worker, advanced practice registered nurse
4 with a specialty in mental health, marriage and
5 family therapist, or physician with a specialty
6 in psychiatry; and

(K) Courses related to domestic violence;

(2) Completion of not less than three thousand hours of 8 9 post-graduate experience in the practice of mental 10 health counseling, with one hundred hours of face-to-11 face clinical supervision that shall be completed in no less than two years and in no more than four years, 12 under the clinical supervision of a person who is a 13 14 licensed mental health counselor, psychologist, 15 clinical social worker, advanced practice registered 16 nurse with a specialty in mental health, marriage and family therapist, or physician with a specialty in 17 psychiatry. In collaboration with the supervisor, the 18 applicant may elect to fulfill some or all of the 19 20 supervision requirements through face-to-face 21 supervision that is conducted electronically through a

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1 videoconference service that complies with all federal 2 and state privacy, security, and confidentiality laws, 3 including the Health Insurance Portability and 4 Accountability Act of 1996; provided that the 5 applicant shall review the laws and rules of other 6 jurisdictions to determine the impact, if any, that 7 electronic supervision may have on licensure by endorsement or reciprocity in other states prior to 8 9 electing electronic supervision; and

10 (3) Passage of the National Counselor Examination for11 Licensure and Certification."

12 SECTION 4. Section 453D-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows:

14 "[+]§453D-11[+] Renewal of license; fees[-]; continuing 15 education requirement. (a) Licenses shall be renewed, upon the 16 payment of a renewal fee, triennially not earlier than ninety 17 days before June 30, with the first renewal deadline occurring 18 on June 30, 2008. Failure to renew a license shall result in a 19 forfeiture of the license. Licenses that have been forfeited may be restored within one year of the expiration date upon 20 21 payment of renewal and restoration fees. Failure to restore a

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1	forfeited license within one year of the date of its expiration
2	shall result in the automatic termination of the license and the
3	person may be required to reapply for licensure as a new
4	applicant. All renewal and restoration fees shall be determined
5	by the department.
6	(b) Prior to every triennial renewal, each licensee shall
7	complete a minimum of two credit hours of continuing education
8	within every licensing triennium in courses related to domestic
9	violence.
10	(c) A first-time licensee shall not be subject to the
11	continuing education requirement established under
12	subsection (b) for the first license renewal.
13	(d) Each licensee shall be responsible for maintaining the
14	licensee's continuing education records. At the time of
15	renewal, each licensee shall certify under oath that the
16	licensee has complied with the continuing education requirement
17	of this section. The director may require a licensee to submit
18	evidence satisfactory to the director that demonstrates
19	compliance with the continuing education requirement of this
20	section.

1	(e) A licensee seeking renewal of a license without full			
2	compliance with the continuing education requirement shall			
3	submit the renewal application, required fee, a notarized			
4	affidavit setting forth the facts explaining the reasons for			
5	noncompliance, and a request for an extension on the basis of			
6	the facts; provided that the licensee shall complete at least			
7	ninety hours of continuing education, including at least twelve			
8	hours in ethics courses, prior to the next licensing triennium.			
9	The director shall consider each case on an individual basis and			
10	may grant an extension of the continuing education requirement			
11	based upon:			
12	(1) Practice in an isolated geographical area with an			
13	absence of opportunities for continuing education by			
14	taped programs or otherwise; or			
15	(2) Inability to devote sufficient hours to continuing			
16	education because of incapacity, undue hardship, or			
17	any other serious extenuating circumstances.			
18	(f) The director may conduct random audits of licensees to			
19	determine compliance with the continuing education requirement.			
20	The director shall provide written notice of an audit to a			
21	licensee randomly selected for audit. Within sixty days of

2	documentation verifying compliance with the continuing education
3	requirement established by this section."

14	offering combinations of two or more of these

18	from a regionally accredited institution;
19	provided that the applicant for licensure shall have
20	completed a minimum of three semester hours of
21	graduate-level courses related to domestic violence;

18	SECTION 8. Section 467E-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
20	"(c) Beginning with the renewal for the licensing
21	triennium commencing on July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2019, and

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1	prior to every triennial renewal thereafter, each licensee
2	shall:
3	(1) Pay all required fees; and
4	(2) Complete a minimum of forty-five credit hours of
5	continuing education courses within the three-year
6	period preceding the renewal date; provided that a
7	minimum of three credit hours shall be in ethic
8	courses[ $\cdot$ ] and a minimum of two credit hours shall be
9	in courses related to domestic violence."
