A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE OF HAWAII FILM COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding seven new sections to part IX to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

 "S201-A State of Hawaii film commission; established; purpose. (a) There is established a State of Hawaii film
- ${f 6}$ commission within the department for administrative purposes
- 7 only.
- 8 (b) The purpose of the commission shall be to promote and
- 9 develop the film industries in the State, with a focus on
- 10 creating jobs, fostering economic development, supporting local
- 11 cultural productions, and enhancing the State's global
- 12 <u>competitiveness in the film industries.</u>
- 13 <u>§201-B</u> State of Hawaii film commission; powers; duties.
- 14 (a) The commission shall:
- (1) Develop and promote infrastructure to support film
- production;

1	<u>(Z)</u>	invest in and manage film studios and production
2		<pre>facilities;</pre>
3	(3)	Collaborate with educational institutions to develop
4		workforce training programs;
5	(4)	Partner with local and international film companies to
6		increase production opportunities; and
7	<u>(5)</u>	Serve as an assistant producer and invest in local
8		film productions to generate revenues for the State.
9	(b)	The commission may:
10	(1)	Enter into partnerships to develop film production
11		<pre>facilities;</pre>
12	(2)	Invest in film projects and receive returns from the
13		investments; and
14	(3)	Serve as a co-producer or assistant producer in film
15		projects that promote local culture and industry
16		growth.
17	<u>(c)</u>	The commission may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
18	to effect	uate the purposes of this part; provided that the
19	commissio	n shall not adopt rules in relation to section 201-115.
20	<u>§201</u>	-C Development and support of cultural productions.
21	The commi	ssion shall prioritize the development and support of

1	Tacilitie	s that expand local and cultural lilim productions. The
2	commissio	n may partner with cultural organizations and provide
3	grants to	promote indigenous storytelling.
4	<u>§201</u>	-D State of Hawaii film commission; annual report.
5	The commi	ssion shall submit a report of its findings and
6	recommend	ations, including any proposed legislation, to the
7	legislatu	re no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
8	each regu	lar session, detailing:
9	(1)	Progress on strategic objectives;
10	(2)	Workforce initiatives, including the development and
11		implementation of the five-year strategic plan
12		required pursuant to section 201-E(b)(1);
13	(3)	Tax incentive impacts; and
14	(4)	Revenue generated by film production.
15	<u>§201</u>	-E State of Hawaii film commission board; established;
16	responsib	ilities; composition. (a) There is established within
17	the commi	ssion the State of Hawaii film commission board.
18	<u>(b)</u>	The board shall:
19	(1)	Develop a five-year film strategic plan integrating
20		workforce development business attractions and
21		infrastructure expansion;

1	(2)	Provide policy recommendations on improving tax
2		incentives and diversifying the State's film
3		production industry;
4	(3)	Establish partnerships with local and global film
5		industries;
6	(4)	Serve as the coordinating agency among state, county,
7		and private entities to streamline the film permitting
8		and production processes; and
9	(5)	Foster indigenous storytelling initiatives in
10		collaboration with the State's creative communities.
11	<u>(c)</u>	The board shall consist of twelve members, ten of whom
12	shall be	appointed and removed by the governor pursuant to
13	section 2	6-34, except as otherwise provided in this section, and
14	two of wh	om shall be ex officio, voting members as follows:
15	(1)	The director of business, economic development, and
16		tourism or the director's designee, who shall:
17		(A) Serve as chairperson of the board; and
18		(B) Serve as an ex officio, voting member;
19	(2)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
20		resources or the chairperson's designee, who shall
21		serve as an ex officio, voting member;

1	(3)	One member from each of the counties' film offices;
2	(4)	One member who shall have expertise in indigenous and
3		<pre>cultural storytelling;</pre>
4	(5)	One member who shall have extensive global film
5		<pre>production experience;</pre>
6	(6)	One member who shall have expertise in studio
7		development and infrastructure;
8	<u>(7)</u>	One member who shall be a Hawaii-based producer with
9		significant production credits; and
10	(8)	Two members representing the labor workforce in the
11		<pre>film industries;</pre>
12	provided	that any individual appointed as a member pursuant to
13	paragraph	s (3) to (8) shall not serve consecutive four-year
14	terms as	a member of the board.
15	<u>(d)</u>	The chairperson shall select a vice-chairperson from
16	among the	members. The chairperson may select other leadership
17	positions	from among the members as the chairperson deems
18	necessary	, including but not limited to treasurer and secretary.
19	<u>§201</u>	-F State of Hawaii film commission; executive
20	director;	duties. (a) The board shall appoint an executive

1	director,	who shall be exempt from chapter /6, to oversee daily
2	<u>operation</u>	s of the commission and report to the board.
3	<u>(b)</u>	The executive director may hire other administrative
4	personnel	necessary to assist in the performance of the
5	commissio	n's duties.
6	<u>(c)</u>	The executive director shall:
7	(1)	Develop and implement the strategic plan pursuant to
8		section 201-E(b)(1); and
9	(2)	Prepare an annual budget and allocate resources to
10		achieve strategic objectives, including coordinating
11		marketing and promotional activities to position the
12		State as a premier filming destination.
13	<u>§201</u>	-G Film industry development special fund. (a) There
14	<u>is establ</u>	ished in the state treasury the film industry
15	developme	nt special fund into which shall be deposited:
16	(1)	Appropriations by the legislature;
17	(2)	Donations and contributions made by private
18		individuals or organizations;
19	(3)	Grants provided by governmental agencies or any other
20		source;

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1	(4)	All revenues, fees, and charges from the processing of
2		the motion picture, digital media, and film production
3		income tax credit pursuant to section 235-17; and
4	<u>(5)</u>	All revenues, fees, and income received by the
5		department from its management of public facilities
6		that support film production and workforce
7		development, excluding the Hawaii film studio.
8	(b)	The film fund shall be used by the department for:
9	(1)	Film production incentives and development, including
10		programs providing financial support and seed capital
11		for film productions that contribute to the local
12		economy and global visibility of Hawaii;
13	(2)	Workforce development, including initiatives that
14		expand the skills and capabilities of Hawaii's
15		resident workforce in film production, digital media,
16		and related technical fields;
17	(3)	Industry promotion and marketing, including efforts to
18		attract film production, investment, and business
19		opportunities in Hawaii; and
20	(4)	Infrastructure and facility support, including repair,
21		maintenance, and related costs for state-managed

1	public facilities that directly support film industry
2	workforce and business development."
3	SECTION 2. Section 201-111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"§201-111 Definitions. As used in this part[+], unless
6	the context otherwise requires:
7	"Board" means the State of Hawaii film commission board.
8	"Commission" means the State of Hawaii film commission.
9	"Creative industries" means those sectors that comprise
10	Hawaii's creative economy, including [media,] arts, culture,
11	music, design, fashion, publishing, animation, interactive, and
12	emerging [media] industries; provided that "creative industries"
13	shall not include film.
14	"Creative industries fund" means the Hawaii creative
15	industries development special fund.
16	"Department" means the department of business, economic
17	development, and tourism.
18	["Fund" means the Hawaii film and creative industries
19	development special fund.
20	"Media" means film,

1	riim includes motion pictures, television, interactive,
2	over-the-top television productions, virtual reality, augmented
3	reality and other forms of emerging media, multi-player
4	videogame publishing, and other digitally-developed content for
5	theatrical or digital distribution via streaming, mobile, and
6	broadcast media.
7	"Film fund" means the film industry development special
8	fund."
9	SECTION 3. Section 201-113, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended to read as follows:
11	"§201-113 Hawaii [film and] creative industries
12	development special fund. (a) There is established in the
13	state treasury the Hawaii [film and] creative industries
14	development special fund into which shall be deposited:
15	(1) Appropriations by the legislature;
16	(2) Donations and contributions made by private
17	individuals or organizations for deposit into the
18	<pre>creative industries fund;</pre>
19	(3) Grants provided by governmental agencies or any other
20	source; and

1	[-(4)-	Effective January 2, 2023, all revenues, fees, and
2		charges from the processing of the motion picture,
3		digital media, and film production income tax credit
4		pursuant to section 235-17; and
5	(5)]	(4) Effective July 1, 2022, all existing and future
6		revenues, fees, and income received by the department
7		from its management of public facilities that support
8		[media and entertainment workforce and business
9		development, with the exception of the Hawaii film
10		studio.] creative industries.
11	(b)	The <u>creative industries</u> fund shall be used by the
12	departmen	t to provide for:
13	(1)	A program to provide seed capital for [film, media,
14		electronic sports, and] creative industries
15		intellectual property development projects for export,
16		as determined by the department;
17	(2)	Programs that expand the skills of the State's resident
18		workforce in the [film, media, and] creative
19		industries;

1	(3)	Marketing programs that attract business opportunities
2		in the [film, media, and] creative industries in the
3		State; [and]
4	(4)	Repair, maintenance, and related costs of the
5		department's management of public facilities that
6		support [media and entertainment] the creative
7		industries workforce and business development[-]; and
8	(5)	The support and development of facilities and other
9		initiatives to grow the State's creative industries."
10	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
11	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
12	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 for
13	deposit i	nto the film industry development special fund.
14	SECT	ION 5. There is appropriated out of the film industry
15	developme	nt special fund the sum of \$ or so much
16	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and the
17	same sum	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
18	2026-2027	for the establishment and operation of the State of
19	Hawaii fi	lm commission, including the establishment of:
20	(1)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) executive director
21		of the State of Hawaii film commission position, who

1	shall be exempt from chapter 70, hawaii kevised
2	Statutes; and
3	(2) Two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) administrative
4	positions to support the State of Hawaii film
5	commission, who shall be exempt from chapter 76,
6	Hawaii Revised Statutes.
7	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
8	of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
9	of this Act.
10	SECTION 6. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of
11	the Hawaii film office are transferred to the State of Hawaii
12	film commission.
13	All employees who occupy civil service positions and whose
14	functions are transferred to the State of Hawaii film commission
15	by this Act shall retain their civil service status, whether
16	permanent or temporary. Employees shall be transferred without
17	loss of salary, seniority (except as prescribed by applicable
18	collective bargaining agreements), retention points, prior
19	service credit, any vacation and sick leave credits previously
20	earned, and other rights, benefits, and privileges, in
21	accordance with state personnel laws and this Act; provided that

the employees possess the minimum qualifications and public 1 2 employment requirements for the class or position to which 3 transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further that 4 subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and compensation laws. 5 6 Any employee who, prior to this Act, is exempt from civil 7 service and is transferred as a consequence of this Act may 8 retain the employee's exempt status, but shall not be appointed 9 to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act. An 10 exempt employee who is transferred by this Act shall not suffer 11 any loss of prior service credit, vacation or sick leave credits 12 previously earned, or other employee benefits or privileges as a 13 consequence of this Act; provided that the employees possess 14 legal and public employment requirements for the position to 15 which transferred or appointed, as applicable; provided further 16 that subsequent changes in status may be made pursuant to **17** applicable employment and compensation laws. The director of 18 department of business, economic development, and tourism may 19 prescribe the duties and qualifications of these employees and 20 fix their salaries without regard to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised

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Statutes.

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- 1 SECTION 7. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 2 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 3 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 4 acquired, or held by the Hawaii film office relating to the
- 5 functions transferred to the State of Hawaii film commission
- 6 shall be transferred with the functions to which they relate.
- 7 SECTION 8. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 8 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 9 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 10 the new sections in this Act.
- 11 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

DBEDT; State of Hawaii Film Commission; State of Hawaii Film Commission Board; Hawaii Film and Creative Industries Development Special Fund; Workforce Development; Film; Media; Reports; Positions; Appropriations

Description:

Establishes the State of Hawaii Film Commission within the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism to support the State's film industries. Establishes the State of Hawaii Film Commission Board within the State of Hawaii Film Commission. Requires investment revenues and returns from made and fees and charges collected by the State of Hawaii Film Commission to be deposited into the Film Industry Development Special Fund. Makes conforming amendments to the Hawaii Film and Creative Industries Development Special Fund. Allows the Department to use the film fund to provide the support and development of facilities, film tax incentives, and other initiatives to grow the State's film industries. Requires annual reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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
