A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIRE PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Section 185-1.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended to read as follows:
4	"[+]\$185-1.5[+] Responsible agency. (a) The department
5	shall take measures for the prevention, control, and
6	extinguishment of wildland fires within forest reserves, public
7	hunting areas, wildlife and plant sanctuaries, and natural area
8	reserves and shall cooperate with established fire control
9	agencies of the counties and the federal government in
10	developing plans and programs and mutual aid agreements for
11	assistance for the prevention, control, and extinguishment of
12	fires on forest, grass, brush, and watershed lands not within
13	the department's fire protection responsibilities described
14	above.
15	(b) The department shall establish an independent program
16	relating to the prevention, control, and extinguishment of
17	wildland fires within forest reserves. The department may

1	perform f	uel reduction on lands not set aside to the
2	departmen	<u>t.</u> "
3	SECT	ION 2. Section 185-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
5	"(b)	The administrator shall have the power and duty to:
6	(1)	Review and approve plans prepared by the managers;
7	(2)	Establish procedures and guidelines for the
8		prevention, control, and extinguishment of fires
9		coming within the meaning of this chapter;
10	(3)	Establish procedures, guidelines, and conditions for
11		the issuance of burning permits and for determining
12		periods when forest reserves, public hunting areas,
13		wildlife and plant sanctuaries, and natural area
14		reserves shall be closed;
15	(4)	Close or partially close forest reserves, public
16		hunting areas, wildlife and plant sanctuaries, and
17		natural area reserves, by restricting certain
18		activities when necessary;
19	(5)	Summon, when necessary, additional firefighting
20		assistance, equipment, supplies, and materials needed
21		to extinguish fires; [and]

1	(6)	Do any act which the manager is empowered to perform
2		under this chapter[-]; and
3	(7)	Establish and maintain facilities for the performance
4		of fire protection, fire prevention, pest control, and
5		forest and range protection and enhancement

7	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
9	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
10	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
11	year 2026	-2027 for the purposes of this part and the
12	establish	ment of full-time equivalent (FTE)
13	positions	•
14	The :	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
15	of land a	nd natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
16		PART II
17	SECT	ION 4. The state fire council may amend the state fire
18	code to re	equire that every owner or other person having charge
19	of or cont	trol over any building, structure, or other premises or
20	any holde:	r of an easement located in a hazardous fire area
21	shall:	

1	(1)	Maintain an effective firebreak by removing and
2		clearing flammable vegetation and combustible growth
3		from areas within thirty feet of the building,
4		structure, or premises; provided that single specimens
5		of trees, ornamental shrubbery, or similar plants used
6		as ground cover that do not rapidly transmit fire need
7		not be removed or cleared;

- (2) Maintain an effective firebreak by removing and clearing flammable vegetation and combustible growth from areas within one hundred feet of the building, structure, or premises when hazardous conditions cause a firebreak of thirty feet to be insufficient to provide reasonable safety; provided that grass and other vegetation located more than thirty feet from buildings or structures and less than eighteen inches in height above the ground need not be removed where necessary to stabilize the soil and prevent erosion;
 - (3) Remove portions of trees that extend within ten feet of any chimney outlet of the building or structure;
- (4) Remove deadwood from trees adjacent to or overhanging the building or structure; and

1	(3)	maintain the root of the bullding of structure free of
2		leaves, needles, or other dead vegetative growth.
3		PART III
4	SECT	ION 5. (a) The department of land and natural
5	resources	shall establish and implement a community fuels
6	reduction	project to reduce hazardous wildfire fuels on state
7	lands, pa	rticularly on lands adjacent to communities. Where
8	feasible,	the community fuels reduction project shall:
9	(1)	Reduce hazardous wildfire fuels on the landscape that
10		threaten watersheds, communities, and critical public
11		infrastructure such as powerlines and communication
12		facilities;
13	(2)	Create and maintain effective firebreaks along
14		undeveloped state properties that border a developed
15		parcel, including but not limited to schools and
16		residential and commercial properties, by removing and
17		clearing flammable vegetation and combustible growth
18		from areas within thirty feet of the developed parcel;
19	(3)	Reduce flammable grasses on the landscape through
20		projects like managed grazing; and

1	(4) Provide water infrastructure for grazing and fire
2	suppression.
3	(b) The department of land and natural resources shall
4	submit a report to the legislature no later than twenty days
5	prior to the convening of each regular session detailing the
6	progress made toward meeting the requirements of subsection (a)
7	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
9	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
10	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
11	year 2026-2027 for the division of forestry and wildlife of the
12	department of land and natural resources' community fuels
13	reduction project to support wildfire prevention and hazardous
14	fuel reduction measures pursuant to section 5 of this Act.
15	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
16	of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
17	SECTION 7. Beginning with fiscal year 2027-2028 and each
18	fiscal year thereafter, the department of land and natural
19	resources shall establish the community fuels reduction project
20	as a separate line item within the department's budget.

- 1 SECTION 8. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000;
- 7 provided that parts I and III shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

Report Title:

DLNR; Forestry and Wildlife; State Fire Council; State Fire Code; Property Owners; Hazardous Fire Areas; Fire Prevention; Community Fuels Reduction Project; Report; Budget; Appropriations

Description:

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to establish an independent program relating to the prevention, control, and extinguishment of wildland fires within forest reserves. Authorizes the Administrator of Forestry and Wildlife to establish and maintain facilities for the performance of fire protection, fire prevention, pest control, and forest and range protection and enhancement activities. Allows the State Fire Council to amend the State Fire Code to require certain owners and occupants of properties and holders of easements located in hazardous fire areas to maintain effective firebreaks and to practice other fire prevention activities. Establishes the Community Fuels Reduction Project to be administered by the Department of Land and Natural Resources. Requires reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

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
