# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii Symphony
 Orchestra provides a major public service to the State and makes
 major musical contributions to the artistic and cultural
 education of the community through its performances.

5 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii Symphony 6 Orchestra was founded in 1900 as the Honolulu Symphony Orchestra 7 to establish and operate a professional symphony orchestra in 8 Hawaii. The symphony hosts shows and programs featuring 9 musicians and performing artists from around the world, in 10 addition to promoting local talent within Hawaii.

11 The legislature notes that Act 382, Session Laws of Hawaii 12 1987 (Act 382), established the Honolulu Symphony Endowment Fund 13 to provide financial support to the Honolulu Symphony. The 14 legislative history of Act 382 stated that the Honolulu Symphony 15 is a major cultural resource of Hawaii and is deserving of the 16 support provided by Act 382; and in Act 258, Session Laws of 17 Hawaii 1988, the name of the Honolulu Symphony Endowment Fund

was changed to the State of Hawaii Endowment Fund.
 Subsequently, Act 175, Session Laws of Hawaii 1995, clarified
 that the income and capital gains of the State of Hawaii
 Endowment Fund were to be used for the production of music by an
 Oahu-based symphony orchestra and stated that it was to support
 a live symphonic orchestra for the residents in Hawaii.

7 The legislature further finds that the Hawaii Symphony 8 Orchestra has suffered through financial instability throughout the last twenty years, including filing for bankruptcy and 9 10 liquidating its assets for auction. In 2009, a small group of 11 supporters, donors, and musicians revived the orchestra as it is 12 known today, the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra, with the mission to 13 reach out to the community through music. The legislature further notes that the Orchestra heavily relies on donations, 14 15 concert ticket sales, and some state funding to fund its 16 operations.

17 The legislature recognizes that the State has a certain 18 responsibility to the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra Band for the 19 public services it provides. The legislature notes that 20 designating the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra as the "State of 21 Hawaii Symphony Orchestra" will enable the Hawaii Symphony

Orchestra to regularly obtain state funds to help cover its
 general operating costs in exchange for other services to the
 State, to be mutually negotiated.

4 The legislature finds that the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra 5 has served and continues to serve a public purpose through free 6 performances at parks and outdoor community centers, education 7 concerts, showcasing young musicians, and performing side-byside with the Hawaii Youth Symphony, as well as providing free 8 9 admission for public school faculty, staff, and students to 10 attend shows through department of education programs. These 11 community program initiatives exemplify the Hawaii Symphony 12 Orchestra's service and dedication to the public. The 13 legislature concludes that exempting appropriations of state 14 general revenues to the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra from the 15 requirements of chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, complies 16 with the public purpose requirement of article VII, section 4, 17 of the Hawaii State Constitution.

18 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

19 (1) Designate the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra as the "State

#### Description:

Designates the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra as the State of Hawaii Symphony Orchestra. Exempts general fund appropriations to the State of Hawaii Symphony Orchestra from the requirements of chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Requires annual reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds for general operating costs of the Orchestra and for deposit into the State of Hawaii Endowment Fund. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)

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
