## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of aerial 2 fireworks during celebrations continues to cause significant disruption and concern. The legislature believes that a 3 4 stronger deterrent is needed to curtail the use of illegal 5 fireworks. According to the 2011 Report of the Illegal 6 Fireworks Task Force to the Legislature for the Regular Session of 2011, an increase in fines associated with illegal fireworks 7 8 may act as a stronger deterrent. 9 The purpose of this Act is to increase the fines that may 10 be assessed against certain fireworks-related violations. 11 SECTION 2. Section 132D-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 13 "(b) Except as provided in subsection (a) or as otherwise 14 specifically provided for in this chapter, any person violating
- more than [\$5,000] \$ for each violation.
- 17 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in this section,

any other provision of this chapter, shall be fined [no] not

4	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
5	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
6	begun before its effective date.
7	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
