#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the single greatest
- 2 recent factor contributing to the increasing cost of living in
- 3 Hawaii is the rising cost of transportation. Due to
- 4 increasingly expensive fossil fuels and a lack of cheaper
- 5 transit options, Hawaii residents pay among the highest costs to
- 6 commute in the country. In January 2022, the United States
- 7 Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that auto-related costs were
- 8 an astonishing twenty-three per cent higher than the year
- 9 before.
- 10 The legislature also finds that electric bicycles are
- 11 significantly more cost effective for local families, better for
- 12 the environment than gas-powered motor vehicles, and can
- 13 effectively get many Hawaii residents to locations as
- 14 conveniently as gas-powered motor vehicles. The current
- 15 electric bicycle and moped rebate program, even with minimal
- 16 promotion and low subsidy, has helped almost three hundred
- 17 people access electric bikes since its inception. However, its



- 1 reach has been limited by age restrictions and a lower rebate
- 2 than other similar programs that does not afford access to many
- 3 lower-income families.
- 4 In 2022, Denver's electric bike rebate program, which
- 5 provided families with up to a \$1,200 rebate, led to
- 6 considerable cost savings for Denver families, helped reduce
- 7 vehicular traffic on crowded roads, and ultimately replaced many
- 8 trips by car with trips by bike. This meant twenty-two miles a
- 9 week on average per user, collectively displacing one hundred
- 10 thousand miles weekly. Ninety-six per cent of users surveyed
- 11 said the availability of the rebate made the difference when
- 12 deciding to buy an electric bike.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 14 (1) Help reduce the cost of transportation, the cost of
- 15 living, and traffic on Hawaii's roads by improving the
- existing electric bicycle and moped rebate program to
- further encourage the purchase and use of adaptive
- 18 electric bicycles, electric bicycles, electric mopeds,
- and other electric mobility devices; and

1	(2) Update the definitions of "electric mobility device"
2	and "electric bicycle" to align with federal and state
3	policies and programs.
4	SECTION 2. Section 196-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding four new definitions to be appropriately
6	inserted and to read as follows:
7	""Adaptive electric bicycle" means any bicycle that is
8	modified to fit the needs of an individual rider who is unable
9	to use a standard electric bicycle.
10	"Electric bicycle" means a bicycle equipped with fully
11	operable pedals, a saddle or seat for the rider, and an electric
12	motor of seven hundred fifty watts or less that meets the
13	requirements of one of the following three classes:
14	(1) Class 1 electric bicycle, which is an electric bicycle
15	equipped with a motor that provides assistance only
16	when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to provide
17	assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of
18	<pre>twenty miles per hour;</pre>
19	(2) Class 2 electric bicycle, which is an electric bicycle
20	equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to
21	propel the bicycle, and that is not capable of

1		providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the
2		speed of twenty miles per hour; or
3	(3)	Class 3 electric bicycle, which is an electric bicycle
4		equipped with a motor that provides assistance only
5		when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to provide
6		assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of
7		twenty-eight miles per hour.
8	" <u>Ele</u>	ctric micro-mobility device" means any ground
9	transport	ation device, such as a standing scooter, skateboard,
10	board rid	ing on a single or double wheels, or similar device,
11	that is p	owered either exclusively by electricity from a battery
12	charged f	rom an external source, or by electricity from a
13	battery c	harged from an external source in addition to human
14	power, wh	ich is designed to transport a single person, with a
15	range no	less than twelve miles and maximum speed of twenty-
16	eight mile	es per hour, on which a person may reasonably commute
17	to and fr	om regular destinations.
18	"Ele	ctric mobility device" means an adaptive electric
19	bicycle,	electric bicycle, electric micro-mobility device, or
20	electric :	mopeds."

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         SECTION 3. Section 196-7.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
    amended to read as follows:

14	(1)	Prepare any forms that may be necessary for an
15		applicant to claim a rebate pursuant to this section;

17	(2)	Require each applicant to furnish reasonable
18		information to ascertain the validity of the claim,
19		including but not limited to [the signature of the
20		buyer and individual responsible for the sale on
21		behalf of a retail store at the time of sale, a copy

1	of valid government issued photo identification of the
2	buyer at the time of the sale, receipt of purchase,
3	name and address of the retail store, verification of
4	eligibility, and any other documentation necessary to
5	demonstrate the legitimate purchase of a new electric
6	[bicycle or new electric moped.] mobility device.
7	(e) The department of transportation may establish a
8	retailer application and portal to provide rebates directly at
9	the point of sale to expedite the rebate process.
10	$[\frac{(e)}{(e)}]$ This section shall apply to new:
11	(1) Electric bicycles [capable of speeds of no more than
12	twenty-eight miles per hour; and];
13	(2) Electric mopeds[ $_{m{ au}}$ ]:
14	(3) Adaptive electric bicycles; and
15	(4) Electric micro-mobility devices,
16	purchased at a retail store after July 1, 2022.
17	$[\frac{f}{f}]$ (g) Applicants shall submit an application to the
18	department of transportation within twelve months of the date of
19	purchase to claim a rebate from the electric [bicycle and
20	electric -moped] mobility device rebate program. Failure to

1	appry wit	min twerve months of the date of purchase shall
2	constitut	e a waiver of the right to claim the rebate.
3	[ <del>-(g)</del>	] (h) Nothing in this section shall alter taxes due on
4	the origi	nal purchase. Any rebate received pursuant to this
5	section s	hall not be considered income for the purposes of state
6	or county	taxes.
7	<u>(i)</u>	In administering the electric mobility device rebate
8	program,	the department of transportation shall provide rebates
9	to:	
10	(1)	Persons who are residents of the State and fifteen
11		years or older, who purchase a new qualifying electric
12		bicycle, electric moped, adaptive electric bicycle, or
13		electric micro-mobility device; and
14	(2)	Non-profit organizations who are registered in the
15		State who purchase one or more new qualifying electric
16		bicycles, electric mopeds, or electric micro-mobility
17		devices.
18	[ <del>(h)</del>	] <u>(j)</u> In administering the electric [ <del>bicycle and</del>
19	electric :	moped] mobility device rebate program, the department
20	of transp	ortation shall provide [rebates] an assistance rebate
21	in additi	on to the rebate in subsection (b). The additional



1	assistanc	e repate shall be \$750 or the full retail amount,
2	whichever	amount is lower, to persons [eighteen] fifteen years
3	or older	who:
4	(1)	Are eligible for:
5		(A) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program;
6		(B) The free and reduced price lunch program;
7		(C) Section 8 of the United States Housing Act of
8		1937, as amended; or
9		(D) Similar low-income assistance programs identified
10		by the department of transportation;
11	(2)	Do not own a registered motor vehicle with four or
12		more wheels, as demonstrated by an affidavit signed by
13		the applicant at the time of sale of the new electric
14		bicycle [or], electric moped, adaptive electric
15		bicycle, or electric micro-mobility device, which may
16		be audited by the department of transportation; or
17	(3)	Are enrolled in school, community college, or
18		university.
19	[ <del>(i)</del>	] (k) The department of transportation may contract
20	with a th	ird-party administrator to operate and manage the
21	electric	[ <del>bicycle-and electric moped</del> ] mobility device rebate

- 1 program. The third-party administrator may pay rebates to each
- 2 rebate applicant from moneys transferred pursuant to subsection
- 3 (k) from the electric mobility device subaccount within the
- 4 highway development special fund. The third-party administrator
- 5 shall not be deemed to be a "governmental body" as defined in
- 6 section 103D-104; provided that all moneys transferred to the
- 7 third-party administrator shall have been appropriated by the
- 8 legislature or shall be from moneys provided by the federal
- 9 government or private funding sources. The third-party
- 10 administrator shall not expend more than ten per cent of the
- 11 amounts appropriated for the rebate program, or any other
- 12 reasonable percentage determined by the department of
- 13 transportation, for administration, promotion, and reporting of
- 14 the electric [bicycle and electric moped] mobility device rebate
- 15 program.
- 16 (1) The department of transportation shall provide an
- 17 annual report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 18 to the convening of each regular session that shall detail the
- 19 rebates provided by zip code, amount received, and type of
- 20 rebate."



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# S.B. NO. 484

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1	SECTION 4. Section 264-122, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
3	"(d) There is established within the highway development
4	special fund an electric [bicycle and electric moped] mobility
5	<u>device</u> subaccount. The department shall expend moneys in the
6	subaccount for the purposes of funding the electric [bicycle-and
7	electric moped] mobility device rebate program established
8	pursuant to section 196-7.8."
9	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
