A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that agriculture is a
- 2 cornerstone and vital sector of Hawaii's economy. However,
- 3 farmers are facing increasing pressures to produce critically
- 4 important agricultural products in the State. Often, the most
- 5 pressing issue is water scarcity, which exacerbates challenges
- $\mathbf{6}$ experienced by local farmers and producers.
- 7 The legislature further finds that current gray water
- 8 guidelines, originally designed to protect public health and the
- 9 environment, inadvertently hinder agricultural productivity,
- 10 innovation, and sustainability. Strict regulations governing
- 11 the reuse of gray water, which includes wastewater from sinks,
- 12 showers, and laundry, disproportionately affect small farms
- 13 where farmers often find themselves limited in their ability to
- 14 harness this valuable resource for irrigation.
- 15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize
- 16 smaller farms of ten square acres or less in size, to utilize
- 17 gray water to irrigate their farming operations.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 342D-70, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) The department may authorize any county to implement
- 4 a gray water recycling program within its jurisdiction. The
- 5 gray water recycling program shall be limited to the use of gray
- 6 water for the purpose of irrigating lawns $[\frac{and}{r}]_{,}$ gardens $[\frac{1}{r}]_{,}$ and
- 7 farms of less than ten square acres. All use of gray water
- 8 shall conform to the state plumbing code, chapter 3-183, Hawaii
- 9 administrative rules."
- 10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
