A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROTECTIVE ORDERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 2 by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
- 3 as follows:
- 4 "PART . HAWAII HOPE CARD PROGRAM
- 5 §28-A Hawaii hope card program. (a) There is established
- 6 within the department of the attorney general a program to be
- 7 known as the Hawaii hope card program. The Hawaii hope card
- 8 program shall be responsible for issuing hope cards to holders
- 9 of a long-term protective order to allow law enforcement to
- 10 quickly verify the existence of the long-term protective order
- 11 and easily obtain information regarding the long-term protective
- 12 order.
- (b) The department of the attorney general shall employ,
- 14 without regard to chapter 76, a coordinator and an assistant to
- 15 the coordinator and other personnel as necessary to promote the
- 16 effective and efficient conduct of the Hawaii hope card
- 17 program's activities.

- 5 under section 604-10.5, or an order granted for more than one

- 7 §28-B Access to Hawaii hope card program information;
- 8 verification. (a) The department of the attorney general shall
- 9 maintain a confidential database of all hope cards, issued by
- 10 the Hawaii hope card program and their related long-term
- 11 protective orders that only the hope program and law enforcement
- 12 personnel may access to verify the existence and scope of a
- 13 long-term protective order.
- 14 (b) For the duration of the long-term protective order,
- 15 internet and telephone access to the database shall be provided

- 5 is established in the state treasury the Hawaii hope card
- 6 program special fund, into which shall be deposited the
- 7 following moneys:
- 8 (1) All fees collected by the department of the attorney9 general for the purposes of carrying out this part;
- 10 (2) Appropriations by the legislature to the special fund;
 11 and
- (3) Gifts, donations, and grants from public agencies andprivate persons.
- 14 (b) The Hawaii hope card program special fund shall be
 15 administered by the department of the attorney general and shall
 16 be used for administering and operating the Hawaii hope card
 17 program.
- 18 (c) The department of the attorney general may expend
 19 moneys from the fund:
- 20 (1) For long-term and temporary staff positions;

8	(d)	The department of the attorney general shall submit a	
9	report to	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the	
10	convening	of each regular session to provide an accounting of	
11	the receipts and expenditures of the fund."

13	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

- 7 by section 1 of this Act no later than January 1, 2026.
- **8** SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by
- 9 section 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 10 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 11 the new sections in this Act.
- 12 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
