# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that since January 1, 2 2022, all cat and dog owners in Hawaii have been required to 3 have a microchip implanted in their pet and to register that microchip number and the owner's contact information with a 4 5 microchip registration company. The legislature further finds 6 that when employees of the state and county agencies responsible 7 for disposing roadkill pick up dead cats and dogs that have been 8 killed on public roadways, they do not routinely scan the 9 deceased animals for microchips or take any other measures to 10 ascertain the animal's owner. As a result, owners of lost cats 11 or dogs are not informed if their pet has been killed by a 12 vehicle.

13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the14 appropriate state and county agencies to:

15 (1) Scan deceased cats and dogs collected from public16 roadways for microchips and, if applicable, record the



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1		microchip as well as any other relevant information		
2		from the animal's tag or collar;		
3	(2)	Notify county animal services or animal service		
4		contractors of the deceased dog or cat; and		
5	(3)	Appropriate funds for the purchase of microchip		
6		scanning equipment.		
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 264, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
9	and to read as follows:			
10	"§264- Deceased cats and dogs; disposal. (a) When			
11	disposing of a deceased cat or dog found on a public roadway,			
12	the department shall check for, scan, and record the microchip			
13	of the deceased cat or dog, if any, along with the location			
14	found, descriptive information of the cat or dog and, if			
15	applicable, any contact information such as a phone number,			
16	name, or address shown on the animal's collar or tag.			
17	(b) When disposing of a deceased cat or dog found on a			
18	public roadway, the department shall timely notify the			
19	appropriate county animal services or animal service contractors			
20	of the deceased cat or dog, including the microchip number, if			
21	any; location found; descriptive information about the cat or			



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1	dog; and, if applicable, any contact information such as a phone					
2	number, name, or address shown on the animal's collar or tag."					
3	SECTION 3. Chapter 265A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
4	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated					
5	and to read as follows:					
6	"§265A- Deceased cats and dogs; disposal. (a) When					
7	disposing of a deceased cat or dog found on a public roadway,					
8	the appropriate county department shall check for, scan, and					
9	record the microchip of the deceased cat or dog, if any, along					
10	with the location found, descriptive information of the cat or					
11	dog and, if applicable, any contact information such as a phone					
12	number, name, or address shown on the animal's collar or tag.					
13	(b) When disposing of a deceased cat or dog found on a					
14	public roadway, the appropriate county department shall timely					
15	notify the appropriate county animal services or animal service					
16	contractors of the deceased cat or dog, including the microchip					
17	number, if any; location found; descriptive information about					
18	the cat or dog; and, if applicable, any contact information such					
19	as a phone number, name, or address shown on the animal's collar					
20	<u>or tag.</u> "

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#### Report Title:

Deceased Pet Animals; Public Roadways; Microchips; Notification; Appropriation

Appropriates funds.
