#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes the importance of
- 2 effective governance and qualified members to guide the Hawaiian
- 3 homes commission. In 1921, the United States Congress enacted
- 4 the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act to provide homesteading for
- 5 native Hawaiians, reserving for this purpose approximately
- 6 200,000 acres of "available land". The legislature, however,
- 7 acknowledges the challenges faced by the Hawaiian homes
- 8 commission since its inception.
- 9 The department of Hawaiian home lands has distributed lots
- 10 to ten thousand beneficiaries, but over twenty-nine thousand
- 11 people remain on the waitlist, and more than two thousand have
- 12 died while on the waitlist. Following the 2023 Maui wildfires
- 13 in Lahaina, advocates for beneficiaries have urged lawmakers to
- 14 amend the organization of the Hawaiian homes commission and the
- 15 qualifications and selection process for members of the
- 16 commission.

5	SECT	ION 2. Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as
6	amended,	is amended by adding five new sections to be
7	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:
8	" <u>\$</u> A.	Qualifications of commission members. (a) No person
9	shall be	eligible for election to the commission unless the
10	person:	
11	(1)	Is a beneficiary under this Act;
12	(2)	Will be a resident of the State for at least three
13		years by the date of the person's election to the
14		commission;
15	(3)	Has attained the age of eighteen years or will have
16		attained that age within one year of the date of the
17		next election of commission members; and
18	(4)	Is otherwise qualified to register to vote in the
19		State.
20	(d)_	No member of the commission shall hold or be a
21	candidate	for any other public office under the state or county

9	<u>§B.</u>	Qualifications of the director of Hawaiian home lands.
10	(a) No po	erson shall be eligible for election to the office of
11	director	of Hawaiian home lands unless the person:
12	(1)	Meets all qualifications for the office as established
13		by state law;
14	(2)	Will be a resident of the State for at least three
15		years by the date of the person's election to the
16		commission; and
17	(3)	Is otherwise qualified to register to vote in the
18		State.
19	(b)_	No director of Hawaiian home lands shall hold or be a
20	candidate	for any other public office under the state or county
21	governmen	ts in accordance with article II. section 7. of the



- 1 Constitution of the State of Hawaii; nor shall a person be
- 2 eligible for election to the office of director of Hawaiian home
- 3 lands if that person is also a candidate for any other public
- 4 office under the state or county governments. For the purposes
- 5 of this subsection, the term "public office" shall not include
- 6 notaries public, reserve police officers, or officers of
- 7 emergency organizations for civilian defense or disaster, or
- **8** disaster relief.
- 9 <u>SC. Election of commission members; director.</u> (a)
- 10 Members of the commission and the director of Hawaiian home
- 11 lands shall be elected at a special election held in conjunction
- 12 with the general election in every even-numbered year.
- 13 (b) Any person intending to register as a candidate for
- 14 the election as a commission member or director of Hawaiian home
- 15 lands shall submit to an examination under oath by the clerk of
- 16 the county in which the person resides relating to the person's
- 17 qualifications. In addition, each candidate shall make and
- 18 subscribe to an application in the form of an affidavit
- 19 verifying the candidate's qualifications.
- 20 (c) The chief election officer shall prepare the
- 21 nomination papers in a manner that enables a candidate desiring



to file for election to the commission to specify that the
candidate is seeking a seat requiring residency in a particular
location.
(d) The ballot for the election of commission members
shall be prepared in a manner that provides to each voter
qualified and registered under this Act the opportunity to cast
ballots for the commission candidate or candidates seeking
election to the commission seat or seats representing the county
in which the voter resides. Each ballot shall contain the names
of the candidates arranged alphabetically. Each eligible voter
shall be entitled to:
(1) Receive the commission ballot and to vote for the
number of seats available in the county in which the
voter resides; and
(2) Receive the director of Hawaiian home lands ballot and
vote for one candidate for that office.
(e) The cost of the election of commission members and
director of Hawaiian home lands shall be borne by the department
of Hawaiian home lands using the Hawaiian home lands trust fund.
<u>SD.</u> Qualification of voters; registration. No person
shall be eligible to register as a voter for the election of

- 1 commission members or the director of Hawaiian home lands unless
- 2 the person is qualified to register to vote in the State under
- 3 applicable law.
- 4 SE. Commissioners; directors; terms of office; vacancies.
- 5 (a) The term of office of members of the commission and
- 6 director of Hawaiian home lands shall be two years, beginning on
- 7 the day of the special election held in conjunction with the
- 8 general election of the year in which they are elected and
- 9 ending on the day of the special election held in conjunction
- 10 with the following general election.
- 11 (b) No person may serve as a member of the commission for
- 12 more than two terms, or four total years in the case of
- 13 nonconsecutive terms.
- 14 (c) No person may be serve as the director of Hawaiian
- 15 home lands for more than terms.
- 16 (d) Any vacancy that may occur through any cause other
- 17 than the expiration of the term of office shall be filled in
- 18 accordance with applicable state law."
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 202, Hawaiian Homes Commission Act,
- 20 1920, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

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         "§202. Department officers, staff, commission, members,
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    compensation. (a) There shall be a department of Hawaiian home
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    lands which shall be headed by an executive board to be known as
    the Hawaiian homes commission. The members of the commission
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    shall be [nominated and appointed in accordance with section
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    26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes.] elected in accordance with this
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    Act and applicable state law. The commission shall be composed
    of nine members [\tau] elected pursuant to section C of this Act, as
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9
    follows: [three shall be residents of the city and county of
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    Honolulu; two shall be residents of the county of Hawaii one of
11
    whom shall be a resident of east Hawaii and the other a resident
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    of west Hawaii; two shall be residents of the county of Maui one
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    of whom shall be a resident from the island of Molokai; one
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    shall be a resident of the county of Kauai; and the ninth member
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    shall be the chairman of the Hawaiian homes commission. All
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    members shall have been residents of the State at least three
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    years prior to their appointment and at least four of the
    members shall be descendants of not less than one-fourth part of

    the blood of the races inhabiting the Hawaiian Islands previous
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    to 1778.
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1	(1)	Three shall reside, and be registered to vote, in the
2		city and county of Honolulu;
3	(2)	Two shall reside, and be registered to vote, in the
4		county of Hawaii; provided that one member shall
5		reside in east Hawaii and the other member shall
6		reside in west Hawaii;
7	(3)	Three shall reside, and be registered to vote, in the
8		county of Maui; provided that two members shall reside
9		on the island of Maui and the other member shall
10		reside on the island of Molokai or on the island of
11		Lanai; and
12	(4)	One shall reside, and be registered to vote, in the
13		county of Kauai.
14	The membe	rs of the commission shall serve without pay, but shall
15	receive a	ctual expenses incurred by them in the discharge of
16	their dut	ies as [such] members. The [governor] members of the
17	commissio	n shall [appoint] elect the [chairman] chairperson of
18	the commi	ssion from among [the] its members [thereof].
19	[ <del>The</del>	-commission may delegate to the chairman such duties,
20	<del>powers, a</del>	nd authority or so much thereof, as may be lawful or
21	<del>proper fo</del>	r the performance of the functions vested in the



2	full-time capacity. He shall, in such capacity, perform such
3	duties, and exercise such powers and authority, or so much
4	thereof, as may be delegated to him by the commission as herein
5	provided above. The chairperson of the commission shall be
6	responsible for conducting the meetings of the commission.
7	There shall be a director of Hawaiian home lands elected in
8	accordance with this Act and applicable state law. The duties
9	of the director shall be determined by state law. The director
10	shall serve without pay, but shall be compensated for actual
11	expenses incurred in the discharge of official duties.
12	(b) The provisions of section 76-16, Hawaii Revised
13	Statutes, shall apply to the positions of first deputy and
14	private secretary to the [chairman of the commission.] director
15	of Hawaiian home lands. The department may hire temporary staff
16	on a contractual basis not subject to chapters 76 and 78, Hawaii
17	Revised Statutes, when the services to be performed will assist
18	in carrying out the purposes of the Act. These positions may be
19	funded through appropriations for capital improvement program
20	projects and by the administration account, operating fund, or
21	native Hawaiian rehabilitation fund. No contract shall be for a

1 commission. The chairman of the commission shall serve in a

- 1 period longer than two years, but individuals hired under
- 2 contract may be employed for a maximum of six years; provided
- 3 that the six-year limitation shall not apply if the department,
- 4 with the approval of the governor, determines that [such]
- 5 contract individuals are needed to provide critical services for
- 6 the efficient functioning of the department. All other
- 7 positions in the department shall be subject to chapter 76,
- 8 Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 9 All vacant and new civil service positions covered by
- 10 chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be filled in
- 11 accordance with section 76-22.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- 12 provided that the provisions of these sections shall be
- 13 applicable first to qualified persons of Hawaiian extraction."
- 14 SECTION 4. Chapter 17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 15 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 "S17- Hawaiian homes commission; director of Hawaiian
- 18 home lands. Whenever any vacancy in the membership of the
- 19 Hawaiian homes commission or the office of director of Hawaiian
- 20 home lands occurs, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired
- 21 term at the next succeeding special election held in conjunction



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2 issue a proclamation designating the election for filling the 3 vacancy. All candidates for the unexpired term shall file 4 nomination papers not later than 4:30 p.m. on the fiftieth day 5 before the special election (but if that day is a Saturday, 6 Sunday, or holiday then not later than 4:30 p.m. on the first 7 working day immediately preceding) and shall be elected in 8 accordance with the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as 9 amended, and this title. If the vacancy is for a commission 10 seat, the person appointed shall reside on the same island on 11 which the appointed person's predecessor resided immediately 12 before the vacancy occurred. The person appointed shall serve 13 for the duration of the unexpired term, and shall serve until 14 the election of the person duly elected to fill the vacancy." 15 SECTION 5. Section 12-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 17 "(c) Nomination papers for candidates for members of the 18 board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs, members of 19 the Hawaiian homes commission, and the director of Hawaiian home 20 lands shall be signed by not less than twenty-five persons 21 registered to vote."

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2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) For members of Congress, state offices, county 4 offices, the Hawaiian homes commission, the director of Hawaiian home lands, and the board of trustees for the office of Hawaiian 5 affairs, nomination papers shall be filed with the chief 6 7 election officer, or clerk in case of county offices, not later 8 than 4:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday in June. (a) The 20 department of Hawaiian home lands shall be headed by an executive board to be known as the Hawaiian homes commission. 21

SECTION 6. Section 12-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is



1 The commission shall be composed of nine members. The 2 [appointment,] election, tenure, and removal of the members and the filling of vacancies on the commission shall be in 3 4 accordance with section [26-34] 17-\_\_\_ and section [202(a)] C of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as amended. 5 6 [governor] members shall appoint the chairperson of the 7 commission from among [the] its members [thereof]. 8 [The commission may delegate to the chairperson such 9 duties, powers, and authority, or so much thereof as may be 10 lawful or proper, for the performance of the functions vested in 11 the commission. 12 The chairperson of the board shall serve in a full-time 13 capacity and shall perform such duties, and exercise such powers 14 and authority, or so much thereof as may be delegated to the 15 chairperson by the board. 19	four years; provided that the governor may reduce the terms of
20	those initially appointed so as to provide, as nearly as can be,
21	for the expiration of an equal number of terms at intervals of

The election and tenure of the director and the filling of



- 1 one year for each board and commission. Unless otherwise
- 2 provided by law, each term shall commence on July 1 and expire
- 3 on June 30, except that the terms of the chairpersons of the
- 4 board of agriculture, the board of land and natural resources,
- 5 and the Hawaiian homes commission shall commence on January 1
- 6 and expire on December 31. No person shall be appointed
- 7 consecutively to more than two terms as a member of the same
- 8 board or commission; provided that membership on any board or
- 9 commission shall not exceed eight consecutive years."
- 10 SECTION 9. The terms of the appointed members of the
- 11 Hawaiian homes commission, including the chairperson, shall
- 12 expire on the day of the first special election to elect members
- 13 of the commission that occurs after congressional approval of
- 14 this Act.
- 15 SECTION 10. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 16 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 17 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 18 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 19 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 20 of this Act are severable.



- 1 SECTION 11. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 2 2 and referenced in sections 3 and 7 of this Act, the revisor of
- 3 statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers for the
- 4 letters used in designating the new sections in this Act.
- 5 SECTION 12. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 8 by the governor of the State of Hawaii with the consent of the

9 United States Congress.
