A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RICHARD "BUFFALO" KEAULANA DAY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Richard "Buffalo"
- 2 Keaulana was an iconic surfer and lifesaver. Born on
- 3 September 2, 1935, in Honolulu, Keaulana learned to surf as a
- 4 young boy in the gentle rollers off Waikiki. Keaulana
- 5 eventually graduated to the level of "beach boy" before his
- 6 family settled in his home community of Makaha. Keaulana grew
- 7 to be known as one of Hawaii's most naturally talented surfers.
- 8 His smooth style, switch-stance skills, and "nose for the
- 9 pocket" made him a favorite at the annual Makaha International
- 10 contest, an event he won in 1960. Keaulana captured six of the
- 11 top-four finishes in the contest between 1957 and 1965. His
- 12 achievements led many to consider him the world's best
- 13 bodysurfer at the time.
- 14 Along with his renowned surfing talent, Keaulana was named
- 15 Makaha's chief lifeguard in 1969, a position he held for over
- 16 two decades. He came to be known as the "mayor of Makaha", and
- 17 in 1972, the community erected a statue in his honor in front of

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- 1 the Makaha library. Keaulana was also honored with an annual
- 2 surf contest and beach party in his name, Buffalo's Big Board
- 3 Classic, which continues to be a community mainstay today.
- 4 Additionally, in 2010, Keaulana was inducted into the Outrigger
- 5 Duke Kahanamoku Foundation hall of fame. Perhaps his greatest
- 6 honor and achievement was becoming the patriarch of his own West
- 7 Oahu dynasty, currently in its third generation. Two of his six
- 8 children have noteworthy careers in surfing: Brian, a
- 9 world-class waterman and big-wave surfer; and Rusty, a
- 10 three-time world longboard champion (1993-1995). His family
- 11 continues to be known as "Makaha's first family".
- 12 Richard "Buffalo" Keaulana's enduring legacy of aloha has
- 13 touched generations of ocean lovers and surfers worldwide. A
- 14 friend and fellow beach boy of Duke Kahanamoku, Keaulana's
- 15 contributions to the sport of surfing and Hawaiian cultural
- 16 restoration are everlasting. In 1976, Keaulana was on the first
- 17 voyage of the Hokulea to Tahiti, acting as the voyaging canoe's
- 18 steersman. His unique nickname, "Buffalo", derives from his
- 19 constant connection and companionship with the water, in
- 20 addition to his "large head and copious amounts of hair", as his
- 21 friends would describe him. As Makaha's first lifeguard,



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- 1 Keaulana's legacy extends beyond surfing and his ambassadorship
- 2 of aloha. He not only was essential in protecting swimmers in
- 3 Makaha's rough waters but was a father figure to many of West
- 4 Oahu's youth.
- 5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to honor Keaulana
- 6 by designating September 2nd of each year as Richard "Buffalo"
- 7 Keaulana Day.
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 9 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 "\$8- Richard "Buffalo" Keaulana Day. September 2 of
- 12 each year shall be known and recognized as "Richard "Buffalo"
- 13 Keaulana Day"; provided that this day is not and shall not be
- 14 construed to be a state holiday."
- 15 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
