A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that multiple state 2 agencies are responsible for housing. This structure creates 3 redundancies and bureaucracies that hinder the work of solving Hawaii's housing shortage. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act 4 5 is to consolidate the Hawaii housing finance and development 6 corporation, Hawaii community development authority, Hawaii 7 public housing authority, and office of planning and sustainable 8 development into a new department of housing. 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 10 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to

11 read as follows:

12 "<u>\$26- Department of housing.</u> (a) The department of
13 housing shall be headed by a single executive to be known as the
14 director of housing.

All rights, powers, functions, and duties of: 10 (1) The department of business, economic development, and 11 tourism relating to the Hawaii housing finance and 12 development corporation pursuant to chapter 201H, 13 Hawaii Revised Statutes; Hawaii community development 14 authority pursuant to chapter 206E, Hawaii Revised 15 Statutes; and office of planning and sustainable 16 development pursuant to chapter 225M, Hawaii Revised 17 Statutes; and 18 (2) The department of human services relating to the 19 Hawaii public housing authority pursuant to chapter 20 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes,

21 are transferred to the department of housing.

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All officers and employees whose functions are transferred
 by this Act shall be transferred with their functions and shall
 continue to perform their regular duties upon their transfer,
 subject to the state personnel laws and this Act.

5 No officer or employee of the State having tenure shall 6 suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit, 7 vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or privilege as 8 a consequence of this Act, and the officer or employee may be 9 transferred or appointed to a civil service position without the 10 necessity of examination; provided that the officer or employee 11 possesses the minimum qualifications for the position to which transferred or appointed; and provided that subsequent changes 12 13 in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and 14 compensation laws.

An officer or employee of the State who does not have tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination; provided that such officer or employee possesses the minimum



qualifications for the position to which transferred or
 appointed.

3 If an office or position held by an officer or employee 4 having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not 5 thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in 6 the employment of the State with the same pay and classification 7 and shall be transferred to some other office or position for 8 which the officer or employee is eligible under the personnel 9 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or 10 the governor.

SECTION 12. All rules, policies, procedures, guidelines, 11 12 and other material adopted or developed by the transferred 13 agencies to implement provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes 14 that are reenacted or made applicable to the department of 15 housing by this Act shall remain in full force and effect until 16 amended or repealed by the department of housing pursuant to 17 chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes. In the interim, every 18 reference to the department of business, economic development, 19 and tourism and department of human services as they pertain to 20 the transferred agencies in those rules, policies, procedures,



guidelines, and other material is amended to refer to the
 department of housing, as appropriate.

3 SECTION 13. All deeds, leases, contracts, loans, 4 agreements, permits, or other documents executed or entered into 5 by or on behalf of the department of business, economic 6 development and tourism and the department of human services as 7 they pertain to the transferred agencies pursuant to the 8 provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes that are reenacted or 9 made applicable to the department of housing by this Act shall 10 remain in full force and effect. Upon the effective date of 11 this Act, every reference to the department of business, 12 economic development, and tourism and the department of human 13 services as they pertain to the transferred agencies in those 14 deeds, leases, contracts, loans, agreements, permits, or other documents shall be construed as a reference to the department of 15 16 housing.

SECTION 14. All appropriations, records, equipment, machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used, acquired, or held by the department of business, economic development, and tourism and the department of human services

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relating to the functions transferred to the department of
 housing shall be transferred with the functions to which they
 relate.
 SECTION 15. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
