A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOCIAL WORK.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is facing a
- 2 shortage of social workers to help individuals in the State
- 3 manage their mental health and cope with stressors in their
- 4 everyday lives. This shortage is concerning since social
- 5 workers already have full caseloads and may be unable to provide
- 6 additional services, which may in turn intensify the need for
- 7 help and increase burnout among social workers. The demand for
- 8 social workers will likely continue to rise because individuals
- 9 experiencing depression, anxiety, life transitions, and other
- 10 mental health challenges will need social workers' support to
- 11 address difficult or stressful life situations.
- 12 The legislature further finds that some nonviolent
- 13 incarcerated individuals may have experienced the need for
- 14 social services or may have firsthand experience receiving
- 15 services from social workers. These individuals may be uniquely
- 16 qualified to enter the field of social work as assistants after
- 17 undergoing training. The legislature also finds that to address

1	the shortage of social workers and lack of social services in
2	the State, providing social work training to nonviolent
3	incarcerated individuals may help these individuals reintegrate
4	into society once their period of incarceration is over.
5	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
6	(1) Require the department of corrections and
7	rehabilitation, in collaboration with the department
8	of human services, to develop and establish a social
9	work training program to assist nonviolent
10	incarcerated individuals in exploring a professional
11	pathway in the practice of social work and becoming
12	eligible to work as assistants to licensed social
13	workers; and
14	(2) Appropriate funds.
15	SECTION 2. Chapter 353H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
17	and to read as follows:
18	"§353H- Incarcerated individuals; social work training
19	<pre>program; established. (a) The department shall develop and</pre>
20	establish a social work training program, in collaboration with

- 1 incarcerated individuals in exploring a professional pathway in

- 4 (b) The department may coordinate with accredited
- 5 institutions of higher education, private entities, and
- 6 nonprofit organizations to provide training in social work to
- 7 participating individuals.
- **8** (c) The department shall establish rules pursuant to
- 9 chapter 91 to implement this section."
- 10 SECTION 3. The department of corrections and
- 11 rehabilitation and department of human services shall jointly
- 12 submit a report of the departments' progress in developing and
- 13 establishing the social work training program pursuant to
- 14 section 2 of this Act, along with findings, recommendations, and
- 15 any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than
- 16 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of
- 17 2026 and 2027.
- 18 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
- 21 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

- 1 year 2026-2027 to develop and establish a social work training
- 2 program to assist certain nonviolent incarcerated individuals in
- 3 the area of social work pursuant to this Act.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of corrections and rehabilitation for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.
