A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MARINA RESTORATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Lahaina
- 2 wildfires of 2023 caused devastating damage to the historic
- 3 district of Lahaina, including properties along the oceanfront
- of Front street. This area, renowned for its cultural and 4
- historical significance, has long been a hub for maritime 5
- activities and tourism. Restoring the historic marinas along
- 7 Front street is essential for maintaining Lahaina's historic
- 8 district designation, revitalizing its economic and cultural
- vibrancy, and honoring the community's deep connection to its 9
- 10 maritime heritage.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to create a framework for the
- 12 department of land and natural resources to authorize leases of
- 13 fast lands and submerged lands following a disaster.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:

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1	" <u>§</u> 20	0- Restoration of historical marinas. (a)
2	Notwithst	anding any law to the contrary, the board may authorize
3	the lease	of fast lands and submerged lands adjacent to
4	propertie	s located along the ocean side of any street having
5	structure	s that were destroyed by an event triggering a
6	president	ial disaster declaration; provided that the:
7	(1)	Reconstruction relating to the lease of the fast lands
8		or submerged lands begins within five years of the
9		date of the disaster; and
10	(2)	Reconstructed structure is not larger than what the
11		destroyed or permitted structure was immediately prior
12		to the event triggering the presidential disaster
13		declaration.
14	(b)	The permissible uses under any lease disposed of under
15	this sect	ion shall be limited to the reconstruction, operation,
16	and maint	enance of historical marina structures consistent with
17	the marit	ime and cultural heritage of the area. Permissible
18	uses shal	1:
19	(1)	Support the preservation of the district designation,
20		if any;

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1	(2)	Complement or promote the economic revitalization,
2		cultural preservation, and related recreational and
3		cultural activities of the area; and
4	<u>(3)</u>	Be consistent with community goals, including
5		environmental sustainability and cultural
6		preservation.
7	(c)	Any lease authorized under this section shall:
8	(1)	Not exceed a term of sixty-five years, including any
9		extensions;
10	(2)	Require lessees to restore structures to reflect the
11		pre-disaster historical run order of marinas and
12		buildings in the area; and
13	(3)	Ensure environmental compliance and alignment with
14		community preservation objectives.
15	<u>(d)</u>	Revenues derived from leases under this section shall
16	be deposi	ted into the boating special fund and allocated for the
17	ongoing m	aintenance and enhancement of the marina and area.
18	(e)	The department shall adopt rules in accordance with
19		1 to implement this section, including:
20	(1)	Criteria for approving lease proposals that prioritize
21	(1)	cultural and historical restoration;

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1	(2) Standards for ensuring architectural integrity and		
2.	environmental sustainability; and		
3	(3) Provisions to ensure public access and community		
4	<pre>benefit."</pre>		
5	SECTION 3. Section 200-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
6	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
7	"(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the board		
8	may lease fast lands and submerged lands within an existing		
9	state boating facility by public auction, a request for		
10	proposals, or by direct negotiation pursuant to section 171-59		
11	and chapter 190D, for private development, management, and		
12	operation; provided that any lease of fast lands or submerged		
13	lands pursuant to a request for proposals shall be subject to		
14	section 200-2.6[$ au$] and 200- , regardless to which state		
15	boating facility the fast or submerged lands are attached.		
16	As used in this section, the term "state boating facility"		
17	means a state small boat harbor, launching ramp, offshore		
18	mooring, pier, wharf, landing, or any other area under the		
19	jurisdiction of the department pursuant to this chapter."		
20	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
21	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
