#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE LICENSED CARE FACILITIES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State, through 1 its department of health, has oversight responsibility for the 2 care facilities that it licenses, including adult day care 3 centers, developmentally disabled adult foster homes, and long-4 term care facilities. Decisions on placement of individuals in 5 a care facility and assessments of the care that they receive 6 are often made by family members of the individual. For these 7 family members, access to current information on the pertinent 8 care facilities is essential. 9

The legislature further finds that information on the 10 oversight of these facilities, such as whether the department is 11 conducting inspections, has not been made readily available to 12 13 the public. A recent example where such information and reporting were desperately needed is the Yukio Okutsu State 14 Veterans Home in Hilo, which experienced a devastating outbreak 15 of COVID-2019 in 2020 that ultimately resulted in the deaths of 16 twenty-seven residents. Information on any department of health 17

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inspections of the facility in 2020 was not made readily 1 2 available and questions remained unanswered as to how these 3 fatalities could have been prevented. 4 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of health to make an understandable database-type list of all 5 6 state-licensed care facilities containing information on their 7 licenses and inspections available to the public. SECTION 2. Section 321-1.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended to read as follows: 10 "[+]§321-1.8[+] Inspections; public notice. (a) Beginning with inspections occurring on January 1, 2015, the 11 department of health shall post on its website electronic copies 12 of reports for all inspections it performs of the following 13 state-licensed care facilities: 14 15 (1)Adult day health centers; 16 (2)Adult day care centers; Community care foster family homes; 17 (3) Developmental disabilities domiciliary homes as 18 (4) defined in section 321-15.9; 19 20 (5) Developmentally disabled adult foster homes;

5	(b)	Each report shall be posted on the department of
6	health's	website within five working days of the conclusion of
7	each insp	ection and shall include the following information:
8	(1)	The date of the inspection;
9	(2)	A description of violations of relevant state laws or
10		rules, if applicable;
11	(3)	Plans of correction and the status of corrective
12		actions in response to any violations, if applicable;
13	(4)	A list and description of all corrective actions taken
14		by the facility, if applicable, to be submitted by the
15		facility and added to the report at a later time, as
16		determined by the department; and
17	(5)	Other information regarding the quality and conditions
18		of the facility the department of health deems
19		appropriate.
20	(C)	Each report posted on the department of health's
21	website t	hat reports a violation committed by a state-licensed

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1	care facility as described in subsection (a) shall be removed		
2	from the	website after three years from the date the report was	
3	posted.		
4	<u>(d)</u>	In addition to the reports required by this section,	
5	the depar	tment of health shall post on its website a list of all	
6	state-licensed care facilities with the following information:		
7	(1)	Type of care facility;	
8	(2)	Date the facility was first licensed;	
9	<u>(3)</u>	Date the facility's license was renewed or will be	
10		renewed;	
11	(4)	Date the facility's license expires;	
12	(5)	Date of the most recent inspection of the facility;	
13	(6)	Hyperlink to the most recent inspection report; and	
14	<u>(7)</u>	Any other information the department deems	
15		appropriate.	
16	The list	shall be provided in a searchable and sortable format	
17	<u>that is e</u>	asily understandable by the public. The list shall be	
18	updated w	ithin five days of any change in its information."

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
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1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

#### Report Title:

DOH; State-Licensed Care Facilities; Inspections; Public Notice; Website Posting

#### Description:

Requires the Department of Health to post on its website an easily understandable, searchable, and sortable list of all state-licensed care facilities including information on their licenses and inspections. Requires that the list be updated within five days of any change in its information.

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
