# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY'S 'OLELO HAWAI'I INITIATIVES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that article XV, 2 section 4, of the Hawaii State Constitution affirms that English 3 and 'Ōlelo Hawai'i (Hawaiian language) shall be the official 4 languages of the State. The legislature also finds that the 5 Hawaii State Constitution provides for the preservation and 6 promotion of Native Hawaiian culture, history, and language in various provisions including article X, section 4, which states, 7 8 "The State shall promote the study of Hawaiian culture, history 9 and language".

10 The legislature further finds that the judiciary has already taken initial steps to explore ways of providing 'Olelo 11 Hawai'i resources, interpreter, and translation services to the 12 public. To advance this work, in 2015, the legislature adopted 13 a concurrent resolution, H.C.R. No. 217, Session Laws of Hawaii 14 15 2015, that requested the judiciary to convene a task force to examine and report on establishing 'Olelo Hawai'i resources for 16 the judiciary. The task force report made several findings 17

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1 including that 'Olelo Hawai'i "possesses appropriate specificity, 2 sophistication, and technical breadth of terminology to 3 accurately translate legal terminology from English into 'Ōlelo 4 Hawai'i". Additionally, according to the United States Census 5 Bureau's 2009-2013 American Community Survey Five-Year 6 Estimates, 'Ōlelo Hawai'i ranks number five in languages other 7 than English spoken at home in the State. Further, the task 8 force found that as an independent branch of government, the 9 judiciary could effectively serve as a focused model to 10 demonstrate the use of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i.

While the judiciary has continued its efforts to make resources and services available in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, it is time for more attention and funding to move these efforts forward. The task force report made several recommendations and identified projects that can serve as a guide to the judiciary.

16 The legislature notes that this Act should not be viewed as 17 groundbreaking. Other countries that recognize more than one 18 official language provide access to government services and 19 documents in all official languages, and the United Nations 20 operates in six official languages.

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Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to support the 1 2 judiciary's 'Õlelo Hawai'i initiatives. It is not the legislature's intent that the requested funds supplant the 3 judiciary's existing funding or budget requests. 4 5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 6 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and 7 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 8 year 2026-2027 to support the judiciary's 'Ōlelo Hawai'i 9 10 projects. The sums appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary 11

12 for the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on April 23, 2057.
