# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that certain individuals who came to the United States as children and meet several 2 conditions may request consideration of deferred removal action 3 4 against them for a certain period of time. The Deferred Action 5 for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program provides undocumented 6 immigrants protection from deportation and a work permit. 7 The legislature further finds that postsecondary education 8 prepares graduates for jobs and career paths that typically pay 9 higher wages, which enables them to achieve further educational 10 and career goals and better afford Hawaii's high cost of living. 11 The legislature believes that additional safeguards are 12 necessary to ensure that individuals under the DACA program are eligible and able to receive adequate funding for enrollment in 13 14 postsecondary education programs at the university of Hawaii and 15 are able to pursue higher paying jobs and career paths.

13	considered a resident of the State for the purposes of tuition,
