A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LANDLORD TENANT CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established the residential
2	landlord-	tenant code working group within the judiciary to:
3	(1)	Conduct a comprehensive review of the residential
4		landlord-tenant code and determine whether amendments
5		and updates to the landlord-tenant code are necessary;
6	(2)	Review existing mechanisms available to both landlords
7		and tenants for the enforcement of rights under the
8		landlord-tenant code; and
9	(3)	Consider the feasibility of statutory processes
10		through which injunctive relief might be obtained.
11	(b)	The working group shall consist of the following
12	members:	
13	(1)	The chief justice of the Hawaii supreme court, or the
14		chief justice's designee, who shall serve as
15		chairperson of the working group;
16	(2)	One member appointed by the president of the senate;

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- (3) One member appointed by the speaker of the house of
 representatives; and
- 3 (4) Other members appointed by the chairperson of the4 working group.
- (c) The members of the working group shall serve without
 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
 travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
- 8 (d) No member of the working group shall be subject to
 9 chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because of the
 10 member's participation in the working group.
- 11 (e) The working group shall submit a report of its
 12 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
 13 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
 14 to the convening of the regular session of 2027.
- (f) The working group shall be dissolved on June 30, 2027.

 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that

 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were

 begun before its effective date.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
