A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEAT PROCESSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a need for
- 2 increased meat processing capacity in the State, as smaller
- 3 ranchers and hunters compete for limited capacity, resulting in
- 4 the loss of potential use of wild game meat.
- 5 The legislature further finds that axis deer, an invasive
- 6 species that poses a continuing threat to Hawaii's environment,
- 7 and other wild game could provide significant quantities of meat
- 8 as a protein source and enhance the State's food security.
- 9 However, there is a gap between the hunters and these non-profit
- 10 services because the meat needs to be processed prior to
- 11 distribution. Other states have developed processes for this
- 12 purpose, including licensing fees and funding managed by
- 13 wildlife agencies or non-profits.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to require and appropriate funds
- 15 for the department of business, economic development, and
- 16 tourism to develop and implement a grant program to expand the



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- 1 meat processing capacity in the State, including funding for
- 2 meat inspector positions.
- 3 SECTION 2. (a) The department of business, economic
- 4 development, and tourism shall develop and implement a grant
- 5 program to expand the meat processing capacity in the State.
- 6 The grant program may include financial assistance to establish
- 7 new meat processing facilities with a donation component or
- 8 expand existing facilities to include a donation component to
- 9 enable hunters to donate meat from axis deer and other wild game
- 10 to these facilities.
- 11 (b) The department of business, economic development, and
- 12 tourism may collaborate with the department of agriculture,
- 13 division of forestry and wildlife of the department of land and
- 14 natural resources, and food safety branch of the department of
- 15 health in developing the grant program.
- (c) The program shall provide grants to qualified
- 17 applicants with the following terms and conditions:
- 18 (1) No grants shall be given unless money has been spent
- by the applicant toward expanding the meat processing
- 20 capacity in the State;

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•	(2)	The total amount of a grant to any one applicant shall
2		not exceed \$; and
3	(3)	No grant shall be given for costs that were incurred
4		more than five years before the time the application
5		for the grant is received by the department of
6		business, economic development, and tourism.
7	(d)	The grant applications shall be reviewed and approved
8	by an adm	inistrative staff member of the department of business,
9	economic	development, and tourism. Applications for grants
10	shall con	tain the information as shall be required by rules
11	adopted b	y the department. At minimum, the applicant shall:
12	(1)	Be licensed or accredited, in accordance with federal,
13		state, or county statutes, rules, or ordinances, to
14		conduct the activities or provide the services for
15		which a grant is awarded;
16	(2)	Provide a detailed plan outlining the scope,
17		objectives, and projected impact of the project or
18		projects and a clear breakdown of how grant funds will
19		be utilized;
20	(3)	Agree to use state funds exclusively for the purposes
21		of this program;

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1	(4)	Indicate capability to properly use the grant for the
2		purpose of the grant program for either;
3		(A) The development and establishment of a new meat
4		processing facility; or
5		(B) The capacity for growth for an existing meat
6		processing facility;
7	(5)	Comply with all applicable federal and state law
8		prohibiting discrimination against any person on the
9		basis of race, color, national origin, religion,
10		creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, disability, or
11		any other characteristic protected under applicable
12		federal or state law;
13	(6)	Agree not to use state funds for purposes of
14		entertainment or perquisites;
15	(7)	Comply with other requirements the department may
16		prescribe;
17	(8)	Comply with all applicable federal, state, and county
18		statutes, rules, and ordinances;
19	(9)	Agree to indemnify and save harmless the State of
20		Hawaii and its officers, agents, and employees from
21		and against any and all claims arising out of or

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1		resulting from activities carried out or projects
2		undertaken with funds provided hereunder and procure
3		sufficient insurance to provide this indemnification
4		if requested to do so by the department; and
5	(10)	Agree to make available to the department all records
6		the applicant may have relating to the grant, to allow
7		state agencies to monitor the applicant's compliance
8		with this subsection.
9	(e)	Hunters who donate meat from axis deer and other wild
10	game to m	eat processing facilities shall be granted access to
11	any facil	ity receiving funds pursuant to the grant program
12	establish	ed pursuant to this section.
13	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
15	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2025-2026 and
16	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
17	year 2026	-2027 for the establishment of:
18	(1)	A grant program to expand the meat processing capacity
19		in the State; and
20	(2)	Two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) meat inspector
21		positions.

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
- 3 of this Act.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
